Matthew's tale is less a story of adventurous seekers than of a luring God, drawing others into the mystery of divinity through the birth of Jesus. A star that guides and wise words that explain are what help lead the Magi to their destination. Natural signs and words of revelation are what God works through in our own day to bring us into the presence of Jesus, the Son of God.

The story of the wise men is a journey that surrounds the birth of Jesus. It speaks to all seeking God in today's world. God does not use force to attract others. Angels speak a message of joy for all but give no orders that insist that the shepherds journey through the dark of night to worship. A star appears in the sky but no one forces these astrologers to pack up some gifts and make their way across foreign terrain to kneel and prostrate themselves and do Jesus homage.

At the heart of this story is the message announced in the letter to the Ephesians: God's plan was that everyone be included in the mystery of salvation, that, along with the children of Abraham, "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus" (Ephesians 3:6). God wants everyone to share in divine life—*everyone!* Give it your thoughtful consideration.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany when we recall the arrival of the Magi at Bethlehem and the presentation of their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These unique gifts might lead us to question why they brought those three particular gifts and so I offer for your reflection a passage from the spiritual writer Abbot Marmion, O.S.B. who wrote: "The symbolism of the gifts therefore refers both to the One to whom they are offered and to those who present them. Gold, the most precious of metals, is the symbol of royalty; it denotes, on the other hand, the love and fidelity that everyone owes to his prince. Incense is universally acknowledged to be the symbol of divine worship; it is offered to God alone. In preparing this gift, the Magi showed that they had in view to proclaim the Divinity of Him Whose Birth was announced by the star, and to confess this Divinity by the supreme adoration that can be rendered to God alone. Finally, they had been inspired to bring Him myrrh. What would they show by this myrrh which is used to dress wounds, and to embalm the dead? This gift signified that Christ was Man, a Man capable of suffering, who would one day die. The myrrh also symbolized the spirit of penance and immolation which ought to characterize the life of the disciples of the Crucified."

This celebration traditionally marks the end of the Christmas season and so I would like to take a moment to thank all of you who presented our parish with your gifts of time, talent and treasure to make our Christmas liturgies so special. From the greening and decorating of our church, to liturgical ministers at our celebrations, to the extra hours spent by parish staff and other volunteers I am grateful to all who contributed to make this a truly blessed season at Saint Mary Magdalene.

I would like to share with you a brief passage from Pope Francis' 2016 message for World Peace. He writes: Mercy is the heart of God. It must also be the heart of the members of the one great family of his children: a heart which beats all the more strongly wherever human dignity – as a reflection of the face of God in his creatures – is in play. Jesus tells us that love for others – foreigners, the sick, prisoners, the homeless, even our enemies – is the yardstick by which God will judge our actions. Our eternal destiny depends on this. It is not surprising that the Apostle Paul tells the Christians of Rome to rejoice with those who rejoice and to weep with those who weep (cf. *Rom* 12:15), or that he encourages the Corinthians to take up collections as a sign of solidarity with the suffering members of the Church (cf. *1 Cor* 16:2-3). And Saint John writes: "If anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother or sister in need, yet refuses help how does God's love abide in him? (*1 Jn* 3:17; cf. *Jas* 2:15-16).

This then is why "it is absolutely essential for the Church and for the credibility of her message that she herself live and testify to mercy. Her language and her gestures must transmit mercy, so as to touch the hearts of all people and inspire them once more to find the road that leads to the Father. The Church's first truth is the love of Christ. The Church makes herself a servant of this love and mediates it to all people: a love that forgives and expresses itself in the gift of oneself. Consequently, wherever the Church is present, the mercy of the Father must be evident. In our parishes, communities, associations and movements, in a word, wherever there are Christians, everyone should find an oasis of mercy."

Kingly Gifts

The church's name for this day, Epiphany, means "to reveal" or "make visible." The child Jesus is honored not by his own people, but by wise men, strangers from afar. Only Matthew's Gospel tells the story, and pious legends have added details over the centuries. The Jews hoped for a Messiah, God's Anointed One, to deliver them from sin and from their enemies. Yet here, God's Son is revealed to Gentiles, people like us who are seeking a Savior. We expected Jesus in Advent; we celebrated his birth at Christmas. In this new year what gifts will we give him in return? Resolutions often include a decision to work off the extra weight gained from too much celebrating. All well and good, but why not do something extra for those you love and for your community? Show the love of God that is in your heart, or as Saint Francis of Assisi is thought to have said, "Preach the gospel at all times. When necessary, use words."

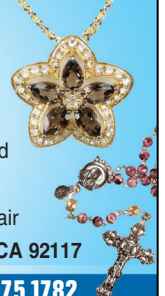
