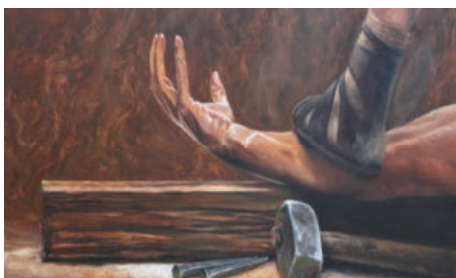

Reflecting on God's Word

A 2006 movie called *Love Actually* has one of the best openings in recent years. It begins with two young people running toward each other and falling into each other's arms, kissing joyfully. Then you see a mother being hugged by her two little girls, then two older women, perhaps sisters, embracing. As these scenes give way to others, you become aware that all this takes place in an airport at the arrivals gate. Accompanying these images is a voiceover.

Whenever he feels down about the condition of the world, the speaker goes to the arrivals gate at Heathrow airport in London. Despite the fact that there is so much hatred and greed in the world, he says, Heathrow is one place where things seem different. At Heathrow love is everywhere.

All the while you hear this voice, you are watching people rush into each other's arms. For a full minute you see the world as a welcoming, warm, loving place. You know it's something of a set-up because who goes to meet people at airports other than family, good friends, people in a loving relationship? But isn't this God's plan for the world, what God wants most from us: love God; love one another.

The voiceover concludes by noting that right before the planes hit the Twin Towers in New York City, all the calls that went out were messages of love. People chose to have their final words be professions of love. Making that choice on a daily basis is what makes us perfect—that is, full-grown, complete, holy.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Each year the nearly one million Catholics of this diocese are invited to share God's gifts by participating in the Annual Catholic Appeal. The Annual Catholic Appeal seeks to raise the \$3.5 million dollars needed to support the many educational, spiritual and charitable works of the Diocese of San Diego. Our response to the Annual Catholic Appeal is an opportunity to advance the mission of Christ not only in our parish, but also in a way that shows that we are all part of one diocesan church.

This year our parish goal is \$57,000, which will go toward two primary objectives. First, it will allow us to fulfill our commitment to the Diocese of San Diego. Secondly, as in past years, any monies received beyond our assessment will return directly to our parish and enable us to continue the many programs that assist us in our ongoing spiritual renewal and communion to which we are called as followers of Christ. All registered members of the parish should have received in the mail a brief letter from me introducing the Annual Catholic Appeal along with a brochure outlining how the monies raised are used in the service of the Church in San Diego and our parish in particular. I would ask that you please fill out the pledge envelope and return it to us as soon as possible. If you did not receive the letter and brochure or if you are not yet a registered member of the parish you may pick up a pledge envelope and brochure at the main entrance of the church.

Believe it or not Lent is just around the corner. This special season will begin this Wednesday, February 22nd with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Our liturgies that day will be at 7:45am, 9:00am (school liturgy) and 6:00pm with the distribution of ashes. Many of you have expressed gratitude for the Lenten "Little Black Books" which will be made available again this year. These little books provide a simple daily reflection for each of the days of lent.

As some of you may have heard Mrs. Jean Coleman, principal of School of the Madeline, has recently announced her desire to retire at the conclusion of this school year. Over the next several months I am sure we will have plenty of opportunities to share our appreciation and gratitude for her over 23 years at our school. In the next few weeks I will be putting together a committee of faculty/staff, school parents interview candidates for this position.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Mrs. Kia Scott, our Youth Minister who, along with her family, recently welcomed a new baby boy to their family. May God bless them at this wonderful time.

The Fight Within

Ash Wednesday, in the Christian church, the first day of Lent, occurring 6-1/2 weeks before Easter. Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season. It is commonly observed with ashes and fasting.

In the early Christian church, the length of the Lenten celebration varied, but eventually it began 6 weeks (42 days) before Easter. This provided only 36 days of fasting (excluding Sundays). In the 7th century, 4 days were added before the first Sunday in Lent in order to establish 40 fasting days, in imitation of Jesus Christ's fast in the desert.

It was the practice in Rome for penitents and grievous sinners to begin their period of public penance on the first day of Lent in preparation for their restoration to the sacrament of the Eucharist. They were sprinkled with ashes, dressed in sackcloth, and obliged to remain apart until they were reconciled with the Christian community on Maundy Thursday, the Thursday before Easter. When these practices fell into disuse (8th-10th century), the beginning of the penitential season of Lent was symbolized by placing ashes on the heads of the entire congregation.

In the modern Roman Catholic Church, the ashes obtained by burning the palms used on the previous Palm Sunday are applied in the shape of a cross on the forehead of each worshipper on Ash Wednesday. Together with Good Friday (which marks the crucifixion of Jesus before Easter), Ash Wednesday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence, where only one full meal and no meat are to be consumed. Although Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation, it is traditionally one of the most heavily attended non-Sunday masses of the liturgical year.
