## THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

### A Scriptural Reflection

#### Reflecting on God's Word

As witnesses come forward to testify in a court of law they are asked, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?" They must respond, "I do" before the court will hear what they have to say. Everyone expects, however, that their testimony will be colored by whether they are hostile or friendly toward the defendant.

In today's Gospel account the woman at the well must have expected Jesus to be hostile toward her. As a Samaritan woman and a sinner, she was considered unclean by the Jews. No wonder she seems afraid and defensive in her answers to Jesus. Yet Jesus tells her the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth. She tells Jesus the truth, too, but it is only a partial truth, the truth that she is willing to admit to herself and to this stranger. When he responds by speaking the whole truth about her past, why doesn't she harden her heart and protest his rudeness, or simply take her bucket and go? It must be the love beneath his testimony that allows her to hear and accept the truth about who she is and who Jesus is. Then, perhaps for the first time in her life, she is free to testify the whole truth to everyone she meets.

Only love can break through the defenses that we erect to hide the truth from ourselves and others. Only love can reveal the truth about a God who responds to our thirsts and ignores our fear and faithlessness. Only love can account for the fact that "while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend all parishes in the Diocese of San Diego will be asked to participate in the Annual Lenten Collection. This collection raises funds for the Church in places other than the United States, places like Latin America, where the Church is still recovering from numerous natural disasters, and places like the Holy Land, the birthplace of our faith. Envelopes for this collection have been placed on the counter in the entrance of the church and we invite you to be as generous as possible. You may indicate on the envelope if you would like to designate your contribution to one or more of the four causes included in this collection.

Don't forget our Parish Lenten Penance Service which will take place on Tuesday, March 28<sup>th</sup> beginning at 7:00pm. We will have a number of priests from the neighboring parishes with us to assist with this celebration.

I would like to thank those who have so generously responded to the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). We are currently working toward our goal of \$57,000. If you have not yet made a pledge to the ACA it is not too late and no pledge is too small. Additional ACA brochures and pledge envelopes are available on the counter inside the entrance to our church. We would like to see as many families participate as possible.

In his 2005 Encyclical letter entitled *Deus Caritas Est*, Pope Benedict wrote about the centrality of the concept of "Communion" to the identity of the Church. He wrote "Love of neighbor, grounded in the love of God, is first and foremost a responsibility for each individual member of the faithful, but it is also a responsibility for the entire ecclesial community at every level: from the local community to the particular Church and to the Church universal in its entirety. As a community, the Church must practice love. Love thus needs to be organized if it is to be an ordered service to the community. The awareness of this responsibility has had a constitutive relevance in the Church from the beginning: "All who believed were together and had all things in common; and they sold their possessions and goods and distributed them to all, as any had need". In these words, Saint Luke provides a kind of definition of the Church, whose constitutive elements include fidelity to the "teaching of the Apostles", "communion" (*koinonia*), "the breaking of the bread" and "prayer". The element of "communion" (*koinonia*) is not initially defined, but appears concretely in the verses quoted above: it consists in the fact that believers hold all things in common and that among them, there is no longer any distinction between rich and poor.

As the Church grew, this radical form of material communion could not in fact be preserved. But its essential core remained: within the community of believers there can never be room for a poverty that denies anyone what is needed for a dignified life."

### Priceless

A well-known priest had been invited to speak at a parish mission. The church was packed and all eyes were on him as he started his presentation. He looked around the congregation and took something out of his pocket. Everyone could see he was holding up a one-hundred-dollar bill. He asked, "Who would like to have this hundred-dollar bill?" People looked at each other and wondered if this was some kind of trick, but hands started going up. He said, "I am going to give this one hundred dollars to one of you, but first, let me do this." Holding both hands up high he crumpled the bill up into a small tight ball. He then asked, "Who still wants it?" More hands went up in the air. "Well," he replied, "What if I do this?" And he dropped it on the ground and started to grind it into the floor with his shoe as hard as he could. When he picked it up, everyone could see the money was all crumpled and dirty. "Now who wants it?" Almost every hand was in the air. "My friends, today you have all learned a very valuable lesson because, in spite of what I did to it, this bill has not lost any of its value. It is still worth one hundred dollars. Many times in our lives, we are dropped, crumpled, and ground into the dirt by the decisions we make and the circumstances that come our way. When you don't live up to God's love for you, you may even feel as if you are worthless. But no matter what has happened or what will happen in your life, you will never lose your value in God's eyes. Whether you are dirty or clean, crumpled or finely creased, you are still priceless to God."

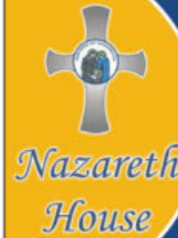
