Reflecting on God's Word

James was a new man. When the nurses and his brother told him how close he had come to dying, he realized he'd been given a second chance, a new lease on life. The new Jim was as different from the old Jim as a newborn baby is from a child in the womb. No longer was he alone and confined in the dark spirit of depression. His tomb of illness had become a womb of new life, releasing him from bondage, giving him a spirit of energy and hope, and connecting him with a helping, compassionate community.

When we hear the promises of new life and invitations to believe in this Sunday's scripture it is easy to think of something after we die. But we have already died with Christ in baptism and, like Lazarus, we have received a new lease on life, this time with the Spirit of God dwelling in us. He was raised from his tomb to embrace a new and richer life of following Jesus. Like Lazarus, whose tomb became a womb of new life, we also have "new" and richer lives to live in the Spirit of faith, gratitude, love, and hope.

Dear Parishioners,

Each year in the Diocese of San Diego, on the week prior to Holy Week, we celebrate the Chrism Mass. It is during this mass that Cardinal McElroy will bless the oils that will be used during celebrations of the sacraments in our parishes throughout the upcoming year. This year the Chrism Mass will be celebrated on March 30th at 4:00pm at Good Shepherd Parish in Mira Mesa. Representatives from our parish will attend this celebration and receive the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of the Catechumen, and the Sacred Chrism for our parish. The parish will officially receive these oils at our Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper.

I would ask you, during these final weeks of our Lenten Season, to keep in prayer those whom throughout the diocese are in the final stages of their preparation to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at our Easter Vigil.

I hope as many as possible are planning to join us for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please note that our parish communal celebration will take place on Tuesday, March 28th at 7:00pm. Once again, this year we will have several priests available to assist with this celebration.

I would like to thank those who have so generously responded to the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). We are drawing closer to our parish goal of \$57,000. If you have not yet made a pledge to the ACA it is not too late and no pledge is too small. Additional ACA brochures and pledge envelopes are available on the table inside the main entrance to our church. We would like to see as many families participate as possible.

As you will recall about a year ago our parish participated in a diocesan-wide synod in which we were called to look at our Church and ourselves and reflect on where the Church is called to growth. This diocesan Synod is part of the universal preparation for a Church-wide Synod to be held in Rome in 2024. The responses by our diocese, as well as all the dioceses throughout the world, are being prepared as part of a document which will guide the conversations at the Universal Synod in 2024. This report is available in a number of languages. In addition to the diocesan report, you will also find a report summarizing the conclusions of all the diocese of the United States.

I hope you all are planning to join us for our Holy Week and Easter celebrations. Holy Week begins next Sunday with the celebration of Palm Sunday at all of our scheduled masses. It then continues on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper beginning at 7:00pm with adoration until 10:00pm.

Then Good Friday we will celebrate the Stations of the Cross at 2:00pm, followed by our Good Friday service at 3:00pm. Holy Saturday we will begin our Celebration of Easter with our Easter Vigil beginning at 8:00pm. (There will NOT be a 5:30pm mass that evening). On Easter Sunday our masses will be at 9:00am and 11:00am. (There will NOT be a 6:00pm mass on Easter Sunday.)

Not The End

Until the last century most people rarely, if ever, talked openly about sexuality, but all were familiar with death because people died at home. Nowadays discussion about sexuality is common and death is almost taboo. We may be so troubled by death that we substitute other words for it: "Grandpa passed away" or "We lost Uncle David." Today's readings are about death but, more powerfully, about our Lord raising us up from death death of the spirit in this life, when a person turns from God or becomes apathetic—but also the death of our earthly body. If we do not tackle the "little death" of failure to live as Jesus' disciple, we're unlikely to face bodily death with hope or peace. The Good News of Jesus is that we can rise from the deaths of sinfulness and indifference—right now—and because he died and rose again we can hope for eternal life with him.
