Reflecting on God's Word

The head nurse had called Mary Beth in desperation. "The patient in 207 can't talk because of her throat cancer surgery. She is so agitated by her daughters that I'm concerned about her recovery. They fight over everything from what treatment she should receive to where she should go when we release her from the hospital. Help!" Mary Beth had done pastoral care in the hospital long enough to have gotten a reputation with the nursing staff for her healing presence. She was only in the room ten minutes before the patient was calm and smiling, and the sisters had agreed to sit down with a social worker to discuss their options.

In today's first reading we see the Holy Spirit at work in Philip, Peter, and John. They are living proof that Jesus' healing presence lives in them. With words, prayer, and touch they communicate the Spirit that unites the crowds, heals the sick, and brings the Samaritans to life in the Spirit. Looking back at previous Easter readings from the Acts of the Apostles, we can see that now all the believers in the ancient world are united in the Spirit—Jews in Jerusalem, Hellenist Greek-speaking Jews, Gentiles, and now Samaritans. They are cured of their divisions and united in harmony through the healing presence of the Holy Spirit. Alleluia!

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, as we celebrate Mother's Day, we also have the opportunity to reflect and be grateful for the tremendous gift that our mother, living or deceased, is in our lives. Saint Pope John Paul II in his 1988 Apostolic letter on the dignity and vocation of women wrote: "Therefore the Church gives thanks for each and every woman: for mothers; for sisters; for wives; for women consecrated to God in virginity; for women dedicated to the many human beings who await the gratuitous love of another person; for women who watch over the human persons in the family, which is the fundamental sign of the human community; for women who work professionally, and who at times are burdened by a great social responsibility; for "perfect" women and for "weak" women--for all women as they have come forth from the heart of God in all the beauty and richness of their femininity; as they have been embraced by his eternal love; as, together with men, they are pilgrims on this earth, which is the temporal "homeland" of all people and is transformed sometimes into a "valley of tears"; as they assume, together with men, a common responsibility for the destiny of humanity according to daily necessities and according to that definitive destiny which the human family has in God himself, in the bosom of the ineffable Trinity."

I would like to congratulate the 32 students from our Confirmation program who celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation last Thursday evening. We were pleased to welcome Cardinal McElroy for this special event. I would also like to congratulate the students from our Religious Education program who celebrated their First Communion yesterday. I am grateful to their teachers, parents and others who helped prepare them for this step in their faith journey. Over the last three weekends we have had over 60 students from our parish celebrate this wonderful sacrament.

Next weekend, May 21st, will be the final weekend that Deacon Chris Bongato will be with us here at St. Mary Magdalene. Deacon Chris has been serving in our parish for the last nine months while he finished his formation for ordination to the priesthood. Deacon Chris will be ordained, with three other men to the priesthood on Friday, June 2nd at Mater Dei parish in South Bay. Following ordination Deacon Chris has been assigned as the Associate Pastor (parochial vicar) of St. Martin of Tours parish in La Mesa. Chris will begin his new assignment on July 1, 2023. I am grateful for the time Chris was able to spend in our parish and his ministry as a deacon. Please join us for a light reception following the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses on May 21st to express our gratitude and assure Deacon Chris of our prayers as he begins his Presbyteral Ministry.

The Right Connection

In the days when most people could not read or write, storytellers kept the community connected with tales that were entertaining, thought provoking, and informative. Nowadays public storytelling is almost a forgotten art. Instead, we are snowed under with information, news, and commentary by everybody about everything around the clock. Against this background, many of us must "multitask" in an attempt to be more productive and efficient. We try to get as many things done at one time as we possibly can in order to make a little free time for ourselves. Every parent knows how to multitask! But with the rise of the Internet, blogs, texting, and Twittering, something new is emerging, which has been called "continuous partial attention": paying partial attention—continuously—scanning for the best opportunities, activities, and contacts at any given moment. In general, multitasking allows us to stay in face-to-face connection with people, but continuous partial attention can isolate us in our own little bubble, simply watching a screen, often with negative consequences. The average American watches more than four hours of TV each day. In a sixty-five-year life, that person will have spent nine years glued to the tube and has seen two million commercials, with over 53 percent of viewing time focused on crime, disaster, and war. We know that Internet use is growing rapidly, and recent studies show that texting while driving makes people eight times more likely to suffer a serious car accident.

Saint Peter, in today's second reading, says, "Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts" (Peter 3:15). This is a clear indication of what should be the single most important thing in our lives, from which everything else flows—how we prioritize our daily life, how we spend our time, our relationships with other people, how we use our abilities, and how we use our resources. Make the connection to a Christ-centered life and live!




