A while ago the Lysol® brand of cleaning products was promoting a new toilet brush, one that has the liquid cleanser and disinfectant stored inside the handle. Television became its midwife, promoting it as the new generation of toilet bowl cleaners. The ad concluded with a series of housewife testimonials, the final one of which attested, "It has changed my life!" It was but another appeal to our hidden longing that our lives be made new. Or consider the abundance of television makeover programs, even a surgical makeover—the "extreme" makeover. Each of us in some way longs to be made new, sometimes vicariously and sometimes personally.

One of the paradoxes of life is that the more we seek ourselves, the more we lose ourselves; and the more we are willing to lose ourselves, the more we find ourselves. It is, of course, only another way of speaking about love. It seems to be a simple rule of thumb. If your life is in chaos or disarray, if you find yourself unsettled and discombobulated, then forget about your own life and begin to focus on the lives of others. It is how love works, if indeed love does any work at all. It is love that makes us new. It is the ultimate makeover, simply because God is love.

Weapons and war will never create peace; only compassion will, and justice, and heartfelt care for all of humanity. Punishment and the inhumane conditions of prison life will never remake the soul of one who is incarcerated, only hope for a future and a nurturing of the human spirit will. More liturgical regulations and prescriptions will never bring deepening faith life to our Eucharistic assemblies; only love for one another will, and the healing we so desperately need.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

I would like to begin this week by congratulating the members of our Religious Education program who celebrated their First Eucharist yesterday. Let us pray that these young people will continue to respond to the call of Christ in their lives.

As many of you are aware, Bishop Robert Brom, who guided our Diocese for over 23 years, passed away this last week. The following is the statement from the Diocese: It is with great sadness that I announce the death of Bishop Robert Brom at his home this (past Monday) morning. Bishop Brom was a pastor, teacher and servant leader of the Catholic community in San Diego and Imperial Counties for 23 years. He oversaw the building of many beautiful churches in our Diocese, as well as the establishment of two magnificent high school campuses. He was a natural teacher who constantly labored to bring the ecclesiology of the second Vatican council into the heart of the Diocese of San Diego. This dedication to the Council also framed his life-long service in forming men for the priesthood. "Bishop Brom's deep love for our parishes and pastoral vision were complemented by a keen administrative capability in guiding San Diego through years of joy and hardship. In his retirement years Bishop Brom intensified the prison ministry that he began as Bishop and his service to the Missionaries of Charity." Bishop Robert Brom was born in Arcadia, Wis., on Sept. 18, 1938. He was ordained a priest of the Winona, Minn., diocese on Dec. 18, 1963. In 1983 Saint John Paul appointed him to be the bishop of Duluth, and then to be Coadjutor Bishop of San Diego on April 22, 1989. Bishop Brom became Bishop of San Diego on July 10, 1990 and retired on Sept. 18, 2013. The funeral for Bishop Brom will be held Tuesday, May 17, at 11 a.m., at St. Thérèse of Carmel Church in Del Mar Heights. Burial will be at Holy Cross Cemetery.

Change is a part of growing and with that in mind I would like to let you know that Mrs. Gerry Barlow who has wonderfully guided our Religious Education program for the last two years is stepping back to focus on other ministries. I am grateful for her willingness to oversee this program during the difficult challenges of the pandemic. Therefore, we are currently looking for a new Director of Religious Education for our parish. In response to the leak of a draft opinion in the Supreme Court case of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities issued the following call to prayer: "The leak related to the U.S. Supreme Court case of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* reminds us of the urgent need for prayer and action at this pivotal moment in our country. "As Catholics, we care about every unborn child and every mother. Our Church has consistently witnessed in word and deed that life begins at the moment of conception. As the bishops shared in our statement *Standing with Moms in Need*: we pledge 'to redouble our efforts to accompany women and couples who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, and during the early years of parenthood, offering them loving and compassionate care through initiatives such as *Walking with Moms in Need* and countless others.' "At the same time, as we await the Court's decision, we urge everyone to intensify their prayer and fasting that the final decision of the Court will bring about the reversal of *Roe* and *Casey*. "We hope and pray for a change in our laws and stand ready to help all pregnant women in need in each of our communities.

Beyond The Rules

Certain religious groups have taken the banning of prayer in public schools as a threat to the expression of religion in public life. They have successfully lobbied many state and local governments to display the Ten Commandments in public buildings. Some claim that the commandments represent the moral and legal foundation of American society, showing "what this country stands for." Yet no one is advocating the public display of Jesus' words about loving God and neighbor (Matt 22:36-40). Which is easier to do? Keep the rules, or love someone you dislike or even hate? Jesus says love your enemies, especially the personal ones: the colleague who got the big promotion, the daughter who promised not to drink but is arrested for DUI, the husband who has affairs, the company that scammed you out of hard-earned dollars. When we hear the One on the throne say "I make all things new" (Revelation 21:5), we are invited into a new world order in which we center our lives not only on rules, but on loving the unlovable. We can only call ourselves Christ's disciples if we love people as he loved—warts and all—and then let go of the grudges and hatreds.
