ASCENSION OF THE LORD A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

We can get caught up in the details and miss the heart of the message today. Where did Jesus go? Is heaven "up there"? Why doesn't Matthew's Gospel have Jesus being taken up? Doesn't this feast remove Jesus from us, to some place where he "sits at the right hand of the Father"? Sound a little disengaged?

In his introduction to the writings of St. Bernard of Clairvaux, Jean Leclercq writes that the mystery of the Ascension fulfilled the mystery of love in which Jesus returns to the glory of the Father. The Son then sends the Spirit to unite us with the Father in love. Thus, in Bernard's thought, the Ascension is a symbol for the passage of Christ from his life in mortal flesh to glorious life in the Spirit. This same transition from flesh to Spirit can also be accomplished in us, since it has already taken place in Christ.

But we are not simply passive recipients. There is work to be done. Luke's angels bluntly tell the apostles to get moving. Matthew's final scene spells out the work: "Go forth and make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and teaching others to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19). Witness to Jesus, in word and deed.

The task of spreading the good news that is Jesus Christ, teaching others about him, can seem daunting. But we are not alone. We have the promise that the Holy Spirit will work with us; in Matthew, Jesus' final words are reassuring: "I am with you always" (28:20). That is reason enough to work with confidence.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension. Therefore, I invite you to reflect on the words of Pope John Paul II when he wrote: "The event of the Ascension of Jesus made an indelible impression on the memory of the first disciples so that we find their witness to it in the Gospels and in the Acts of the Apostles. Forty days after his resurrection, Jesus led his disciples to the Mount of Olives, "towards Bethany", and "while he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up to heaven" (Lk 24,50-51). Naturally, they remained looking on high, but were suddenly called back to earth by two angels, "Why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus ... will come in the same way that you have seen him go into heaven". "On earth as it is in heaven": the words which we repeat daily in praying the Our Father express well the condition of the disciples, transformed by the experience of the Easter mystery of Christ. They are to be citizens of both earth and heaven. In fact, Christ in his humanity became the bridge between earth and heaven: He is the mediator between God and man, between the kingdom of heaven and the history of the world. United to him in his Spirit, believers form a new community, the Church, whose nature is both visible and spiritual, pilgrim in the world and sharer in heavenly glory. Among all creatures, Mary, more than any other creature, has been associated with this mystery. As the new Eve from whom is born the new Adam, she shows us the way to live our earthly mission. At the same time, since she was assumed body and soul into heaven, she invites us to tend toward our true home, where the fullness of the love of the Triune God awaits us. While the Church sets out into the deep of the new millennium, she does not lose sight of her polar star which orients her navigation. That star is Christ, the Lord of history. Beside him we find his and our Mother, who does not cease to accompany her children on their earthly pilgrimage. We look to her with sincere hope."

Finally, summer is the usual time when things slow down a bit. We are encouraged to relax and spend time with family and friends and generally let our batteries recharge a bit. However, in this more relaxed atmosphere let us not forget that when we come to Church there is still a certain decorum that is expected. Inside Church is never the place to make or receive cell phone calls or text messages. We should always be aware that we come into the presence of Jesus and therefore our dress should reflect a respect for the sacred nature of the Church. Please be aware of the fact that what you just wore to the beach may not be appropriate for mass. Also, please, please do not chew gum in Church. Don't be afraid to give your family member, friend, or neighbor a gentle reminder if they should forget.

Go and Make Disciples

In 1991, guerrillas in the village of Huasahuasi. Peru. executed Sister Irene McCormack, an Australian Josephite missionary. Her "crime" was feeding the poor. Despite warnings, Irene had chosen to stay teaching children in the impoverished village. One evening querillas arrested her and took her to the village plaza, where her captors conducted a mock trial. Sister Irene was accused of being a "Yankee imperialist," pronounced guilty, and shot. The villagers remember Sister Irene and the five villagers who died with her in annual human rights events and community clean-ups. Sister Irene had explained to family and friends that the call to mission came to her through reflection and prayer at the age of forty. She described it as an irresistible inner voice. To be true to herself as a woman, a Christian, a Josephite, and a world citizen, she felt that she had to respond to the Spirit or risk spiritual death.

John Paul II declared St. Therese a doctor of the Church because of her writings and spirituality.




