ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

Grace is not a gift we can enjoy alone. A careful look reveals that all of today's scriptures refer to a group of people. In the reading from Exodus, God's words are directed to the whole Israelite people. The people will receive God's covenantal grace together, or not at all. The psalm proclaims that "We are God's people: the sheep of his flock" (Psalm 100:3c). Here again, the whole people together receive God's gracious kindness and faithfulness, not the psalmist alone. In the Gospel, Jesus pities the whole crowd, and he sends the Twelve together into service. The whole people are to participate in and benefit from God's healing grace.

Finally, we discover that the reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans is written entirely in the first person plural. He writes to the community about the grace that has reconciled and gathered them to live a new life together. It is we for whom Christ died, we who receive God's grace in order to become God's "kingdom of priests, a holy nation," the flock of the Lord. God's amazing grace grabs, gathers, and guides us under the grace-filled care of Jesus.

Dear Parishioners.

This weekend as we celebrate Father's Day I would like to take this opportunity to share with you a brief passage from the Apostolic Exhortation Familiaris Consortio of Pope John Paul II in which he writes about the importance of the role of Fatherhood in the family. "Within the conjugal and family communion-community, the man is called upon to live his gift and role as husband and father. In his wife he sees the fulfillment of God's intention: 'It is not good that the man should be alone, I will make him a helper fit for him,' and he makes his own the cry of Adam, the first husband: 'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh....' Love for his wife as mother of their children and love for the children themselves are for the man the natural way of understanding and fulfilling his own fatherhood. Above all where social and cultural conditions so easily encourage a father to be less concerned with his family or at any rate less involved in the work of education, efforts must be made to restore socially the conviction that the place and task of the father in and for the family is of unique and irreplaceable importance. As experience teaches, the absence of a father causes psychological and moral imbalance and notable difficulties in family relationships. as does, in contrary circumstances, the oppressive presence of a father, especially where there still prevails the phenomenon of 'machismo,' or a wrong superiority of male prerogatives which humiliates women and inhibits the development of healthy family relationships. In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God, a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family: he will perform this task by exercising generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother, by a more solicitous commitment to education, a task he shares with his wife, by work which is never a cause of division in the family but promotes its unity and stability, and by means of the witness he gives of an adult Christian life which effectively introduces the children into the living experience of Christ and the Church."

This means that we must be honest and accountable with God and with one another other about how we handle God's money.
