Reflecting on God's Word

Robert Fulghum tells the story of a troubled man who paid a visit to his rabbi. He had experienced a great deal of failure in his life and didn't feel that he had what it takes to accomplish his dreams. After listening to the man's tale of woe, the rabbi instructed him to seek out page thirty of the *New York Times Almanac*. That would be of help.

Following that instruction, he found that the almanac entry was a list of the top hitters in the annals of baseball, with Ty Cobb leading the pack with a .376 batting average. Puzzled as to how that applied to his problem, he returned to the rabbi for an explanation. The rabbi explained that that page of Hall of Fame hitters represented people who in essence failed about seven out of every ten times at bat.

So if he thought his track record of failure was a problem, he needed to think again. The many failures put him in league with some of the greatest hitters baseball had ever known.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

This week I will be heading out for a few weeks of vacation but to make sure I left you in capable hands I am pleased to welcome back Fr. Bill Heady and a companion of his, Fr. Vincent Stegman who will be covering the parish in my absence. I know that you will welcome them in my absence.

In response to the Supreme Court of the United States issuing its ruling in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities issued the following statement: "This is a historic day in the life of our country, one that stirs our thoughts, emotions and prayers. For nearly fifty years, America has enforced an unjust law that has permitted some to decide whether others can live or die; this policy has resulted in the deaths of tens of millions of preborn children, generations that were denied the right to even be born. "America was founded on the truth that all men and women are created equal, with God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. This truth was grievously denied by the U.S. Supreme Court's *Roe v. Wade* ruling, which legalized and normalized the taking of innocent human life. We thank God today that the Court has now overturned this decision. We pray that our elected officials will now enact laws and policies that promote and protect the most vulnerable among us. "Our first thoughts are with the little ones whose lives have been taken since 1973. We mourn their loss, and we entrust their souls to God, who loved them from before all ages and who will love them for all eternity. Our hearts are also with every woman and man who has suffered grievously from abortion; we pray for their healing, and we pledge our continued compassion and support. As a Church, we need to serve those who face difficult pregnancies and surround them with love. "Today's decision is also the fruit of the prayers, sacrifices, and advocacy of countless ordinary Americans from every walk of life. Over these long years, millions of our fellow citizens have worked together peacefully to educate and persuade their neighbors about the injustice of abortion, to offer care and counseling to women, and to work for alternatives to abortion, including adoption, foster care, and public policies that truly support families. We share their joy today and we are grateful to them. Their work for the cause of life reflects all that is good in our democracy, and the pro-life movement deserves to be numbered among the great movements for social change and civil rights in our nation's history." Now is the time to begin the work of building a post-*Roe* America.

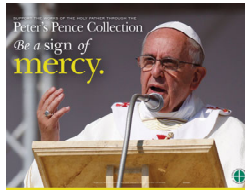

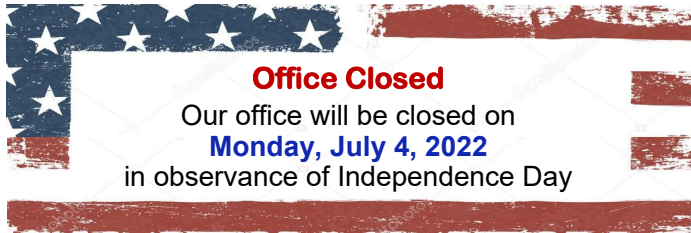

Riches To Rags

The life of Saint Katharine Drexel (1858–1955) is a "riches to rags" story - the opposite of the American dream. Katharine was the daughter of a wealthy banker. Her father believed their great fortune meant that God had great expectations for its use. Katharine was influenced to devote her life and wealth to the poor. She founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament to serve Native and African Americans with education, material assistance, and the Gospel. With her twenty million-dollar fortune she founded sixty schools and established Xavier University for African-Americans. Katharine and her sisters ministered tirelessly. Like the seventy disciples in today's Gospel, they were despised by some for their work, called vicious names, and spat upon. Katharine embraced poverty because of her love for Jesus Christ, gratitude for his sacrifice on the cross, and desire to be united with him forever. Blessed Sacrament Sisters serve today, bringing the message of today's Gospel: "The kingdom of God is at hand for you" (Luke 10:9).
