A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

It's tempting to wish that our faith in God enabled us to have an unfailing trust that God will take us where we want to be. It would free us from diddling with decisions, vacillating and second-guessing. Only that wouldn't be faith because it would be our own script we'd have God carrying out.

Faith in God surrenders the script. It also surrenders the outcome, which is why Abraham, when asked by God to pack up kin and belongings and move to another land, did just that without knowing where or how he'd eventually settle in. And much later, like the unpredictable thread of a good novel, Abraham's story finds him and Sarah with child when they are 100 and 90 years old. A decade or so later, Abraham again finds himself without any sensible or sane understanding of the storyline as he leads young Isaac up a sacrificial mountain to what would seem to be a failure of God's promise to Abraham to father countless generations. Once more God rewrites the ending. Throughout Abraham's life it is God's script that Abraham lives out, not his own.

Faith is unpredictable, like good novels that twist and turn and keep us in suspense. If novels are well written, they keep us up long into the night. On the other hand, we like our lives quite the opposite. The appearance of the unpredictable tends to unsettle and undo our living. We presume that good lives, unlike a good novel, are interesting and engaging but always deliberately focused and free of unwarranted surprises. And so we expect good novels and good lives to be like the tracks of the railroad—parallel, but never touching or crossing lest someone or something be derailed.

Dear Parishioners:

I am proud of the fact that our parish staff works hard to provide the best possible service for our parishioners. However, this task is almost impossible if we do not know who you are. We currently list over 1500 households as registered members of our parish but recognize that many more families celebrate with us on a regular basis. I would like to take this opportunity to encourage those of you who have not yet registered in the parish to please do so. Registration is easy. You can find a registration form at the main entrance of our church. Simply fill this out and place it in the Sunday collection basket or register at stmarymagonline.org. This simple process only takes a few moments and is of tremendous benefit. First and foremost, registration enables our parish staff to more easily address your needs and concerns. Secondly, registered members have priority when it comes to preparation and celebration of the sacraments such as baptisms and marriages and enrollment at the school (yes, membership has its privileges). Finally, parish staffing (including clergy) and budgeting is based, in part, on the number of registered parishioners and so the more accurate count we have the better we, and the diocese, will be able to plan for the needs of our community. Once again, if you have not already done so I would like to invite you to go ahead and register. Also, if you are not sure if you are a registered member or not or if it has been many years since you registered with us, it does not hurt to fill out a new form in order that we may be certain to have the most recent information.

Please note that registration for our grade school Religious Education Program has begun. Once again this year our program will be held on Sunday mornings. If you would like to enroll your child please contact the parish Religious Education Office. Early enrollment assists us in planning for teachers and other resources.

Finally, I leave for your reflection a brief passage from the first Encyclical of Pope John Paul II, *Redemptor Hominis*, in which he proposes a question for us as men and women of Faith: "The development of technology and the development of contemporary civilization, which is marked by the ascendancy of technology, demand a proportional development of morals and ethics. For the present, this last development seems unfortunately to be always left behind. Accordingly, in spite of the marvel of this progress, in which it is difficult not to see also authentic signs of man's greatness, signs that in their creative seeds were revealed to us in the pages of the Book of Genesis, as early as where it describes man's creation, this progress cannot fail to give rise to disquiet on many counts.

The first reason for disquiet concerns the essential and fundamental question: Does this progress, which has man for its author and promoter, make human life on earth "more human" in every aspect of that life? Does it make it more "worthy of man"? There can be no doubt that in various aspects it does. But the question keeps coming back with regard to what is most essential—whether in the context of this progress man, as man, is becoming truly better, that is to say more mature spiritually, more aware of the dignity of his humanity, more responsible, more open to others, especially the neediest and the weakest, and readier to give and to aid all."


