

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

By now just about all of summer has been unwrapped and spent. As the season drains away and summer's light dims, so too grows the realization that the busy work of life must soon be taken up in earnest once more. Once more the realization returns that life calls us seriously to particular autumn cares. No matter how fearful or challenging, each of us must follow that inner voice or else sense that life will have become less.

Such was the story of Jeremiah, who found himself prophet to the Hebrew people. He sensed an inner call to speak God's word against the nation's political alliances and against the king's penchant to trust in military machines. As a result Jeremiah found himself tossed into a well. Yet he remained committed.

It is also the story of Jesus, who came with truth as a walking stick and the kingdom as seeds of life to be scattered and sown. He also knew full well that few would walk where he would walk or choose to feed on what he would sow. Yet he would not back away from what he was about.

Such a willingness to stretch ourselves into the unknown is part of that mysterious list of things that make us human. At such times we walk in the shadow of Jesus as he leads us into new ways of being human. Seldom, if ever, is it without struggle or even pain, yet it is then that we begin to gain a fuller sense of who we truly are, and it is then that through us God brings the world to something new.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

Tomorrow the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary. This feast, which has been celebrated in the Church since the early 5th century, was officially proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1950 when he stated: "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." In her assumption, Mary was preserved from the decay of death. Mary, the mother of the Savior, is the first to share in the Lord's resurrection and therefore she is the living model for all people whose future destiny is with the risen Lord. In a homily a few years ago on the occasion of this celebration Pope John Paul II reminded us "Perhaps, more than in the past, modern man is consumed by material interests and concerns. He seeks security and often feels lonely and anxious. Then what can be said of the enigma of death? Mary's Assumption is an event that concerns us precisely because every human being is destined to die. But death is not the last word. Death - the mystery of the Virgin's Assumption assures us - is the passage to life, the encounter with Love. It is the passage to the eternal happiness in store for those who toil for truth and justice and do their utmost to follow Christ." Please note this is NOT a holy day of obligation this year and so there will not be any mass on Monday.

Believe it or not our school resumes next week. Beginning Wednesday we will welcome our teachers and staff back and then the following week almost 530 students will begin the 2022-23 school year. I am so grateful that we are able to begin this year with all of our teachers, staff and students on campus. Again, I am grateful for all those who have worked this summer to prepare our school grounds and classrooms for this new academic year. Please pray for our students as well as all those going back to school in these next few weeks. May God grant them wisdom and peace as they continue their studies.

In 2007 Pope Benedict XVI spoke on the importance of education when he said: It is education and especially Christian education which shapes life based on God who is love (cf. I Jn 4: 8, 16), and has need of that closeness which is proper to love. Especially today, when isolation and loneliness are a widespread condition to which noise and group conformity is no real remedy, personal guidance becomes essential, giving those who are growing up the assurance that they are loved understood and listened to. In practice, this guidance must make tangible the fact that our faith is not something of the past, that it can be lived today and that in living it we really find our good. Thus, boys and girls and young people may be helped to free themselves from common prejudices and will realize that the Christian way of life is possible and reasonable, indeed, is by far the most reasonable.

However, it is very obvious that in educating and forming people in the faith the family has its own fundamental role and primary responsibility. Parents, in fact, are those through whom the child at the start of life has the first and crucial experience of love, of a love which is actually not only human but also a reflection of God's love for him. ... Therefore, the Christian family, the small "domestic Church", and the larger family of the Church must take care to develop the closest collaboration, especially with regard to the education of children. ... It is up to us to seek to respond to the question of truth, fearlessly juxtaposing the proposal of faith with the reason of our time. In this way we will help young people to broaden the horizons of their intelligence, to open themselves to the mystery of God, in whom is found life's meaning and direction, and to overcome the conditioning of a rationality which trusts only what can be the object of experiment and calculation. ... The task of education passes through freedom but also requires authority. Therefore, especially when it is a matter of educating in faith, the figure of the witness and the role of witnessing is central. A witness of Christ does not merely transmit information but is personally involved with the truth Christ proposes and, through the coherency of his own life, becomes a dependable reference point.

One Person Can Only Do So Much

Asa Kent Jennings was a frail man planning to be a Methodist minister, but World War I intervened. Asa served with the Red Cross, ending up in Smyrna in western Turkey as the Turks marched on the city. Foreigners fled. Asa stayed with 350,000 refugees. The army rampaged and set Smyrna ablaze. American and British warships patrolling the coast did nothing. Asa arranged food supplies, then set out to find Ataturk, the Turkish leader, to ask safe passage for the surviving refugees; Ataturk gave him eleven days. Asa requested ships from the Greek government, which questioned Asa's identity. As the only American left, he boldly said, "I am the top American official in Smyrna." He spent the next year directing a fleet that saved over a million refugees. Who remembers Asa Jennings today? Yet think of all those refugees' descendants and what good they may have done in this world just because of one man's efforts.
