

### A Scriptural Reflection

### **Reflecting on God's Word**

During the first few months of marriage, the honeymoon period, the one we love may seem perfect to us. He or she can do nothing wrong. Soon, though, reality sets in and we start accumulating hurts. We may hurt one another knowingly or unknowingly. It's much the same in a family or a community. Sooner or later our love for one another is tested by sin and human weakness. Will we put up with the other's behavior or confront it? Which choice reflects true love?

Today Paul recalls some signs of true love; he reminds us what those who love will not do. The other Scriptures bring out some of the surprising signs of true love. Loving one another just might involve nagging, confronting, fighting, or telling family secrets. It will certainly involve mutual respect and acceptance, along with a healthy dose of prayer for each other. And true love will seek constantly to call forth the best in the ones we love.

### Dear Parishioners,

It is that time of year again when schools are starting back up and education is at the forefront of our minds. This year classes are full and our mission remains the same, helping our students become well rounded, faith filled, young men and women. I am so thankful for our School of the Madeline teachers and staff who have worked diligently throughout the summer to prepare for the school year with the challenges and blessings, which await us.

Just a reminder that our Religious Education programs have begun taking registrations. If you have a student in Kindergarten through Fifth grades, in need of religious education please contact our Religious Education office or see our parish web site for more information. Our youth programs also include preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation and so if you have a teenager in High School in need of preparation please contact our Youth Office. We also welcome adults who are interested in becoming Catholic or completing their sacraments of initiation (Eucharist and Confirmation). This year our RCIA program will be held on Sunday mornings.

Several years ago the Vatican published a document on the Role of Parish Community. I would like to share some parts of this document for our reflection. The authors wrote: The Holy Father, in this regard, recommends that: "If something should rightly disturb us and trouble our consciences, it is the fact that so many of our brothers and sisters are living without the strength, light and consolation born of friendship with Jesus Christ, without a community of faith to support them, without meaning and a goal in life. More than by fear of going astray, my hope is that we will be moved by the fear of remaining shut up within structures which give us a false sense of security, within rules which make us harsh judges, within habits which make us feel safe, while at our door people are starving and Jesus does not tire of saying to us: "Give them something to eat"

Urged on by this concern, the Church "faithful to her own tradition and at the same time conscious of her universal mission, she can enter into communion with the various civilizations, to their enrichment and the enrichment of the Church herself". The fruitful and creative encounter between the Gospel and the culture leads to true progress: on the one hand, the Word of God is incarnate in the history of men, thus renews it; on the other hand, "the Church [...] can and ought to be enriched by the development of human social life", enhancing thereby, in our present age, the mission entrusted to her by Christ. The Church proclaims that the Word, "became flesh and lived among us".

This Word of God, who loves to dwell in our midst, in his inexhaustible richness, was received the world over by diverse peoples, inspiring in them the most noble of aspirations, such as the desire for God, the dignity of every human life, equality among men and respect for difference within the single human family, dialogue as a means to participation, a longing for peace, welcome as an expression of fraternity and solidarity, together with a responsible care for creation It is unthinkable, therefore, that such newness, whose propagation to the ends of the earth remains incomplete, abates or, worse still, disappears<sup>[8]</sup>. In order for the journey of the Word to continue, the Christian community must make a determined missionary decision "capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation".

Whether a woman, man, or young person, "they" may have been discontented and miserable, or happy and fulfilled, when they helped to produce a warm jacket, a box of cereal, or a bottle of shampoo. Look at any ordinary object and consider how many people it took to make it. A pencil began as a tree someone planted. Someone else cut the tree down; others hauled it away and more cut it to size, added the lead and eraser, packaged it, shipped it, and put it on the store shelves. "They" are constantly busy, millions of "them," ensuring that we have the things we need, from the electricity that powers our homes to the food we buy at the grocery store. "They" may never get a proper thank-you, because there is no real opportunity for us to say it directly. But even when we open our eyes to the multitude of "theys" in our lives, we are just looking at the tip of the iceberg. Every "they" is ultimately a smaller version of God. God is not the farmer harvesting the wheat or rice that will eventually find its way to our tables. Instead, God is the provider of the soil, the sun, and the rainfall that make sure the seedlings grow into a delicious, nutritious food. God made the farmer, and keeps his heart beating to perform his daily tasks. God is the essential "behind the scenes" person, the real presence behind every "they." God is behind everything in the entire universe. And when we finally find God, our lives become transformed with true gratitude.
