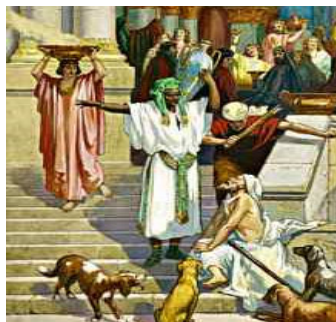

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

If anyone is the prophet of the punch line, it is Amos. He travels up from the south to preach to the people of the northern kingdom of Israel and he pulls no punches. "Woe to the complacent," he begins, and then in a quick series of brush strokes lets them know how God sees them: lying upon their beds, stretched out on their couches, eating their tender lamb and calves, drinking fine wine while the music plays and they anoint themselves with the best oils. Then the punch line - they shall be the first to go into exile. The party is over!

In a similar vein Jesus paints a portrait of "Richman" - tradition has named him *Dives* (Latin for "rich man") - dressed in the best, eating the best, insulated in his own little world, while at his door Lazarus lies starving, with only dogs coming to lick his sores. It is a scene of total indifference to the plight of the poor. God's response is clear. The wheel will turn. And when it does, so shall Lazarus and Richman. What was a gap between them becomes a chasm.

The Letter to Timothy today contains advice from a mentor to his beloved child in the faith. It offers of profile of how the baptized person is to live. It's a shame that the reading does not begin earlier (1 Timothy 6:9-10) and end later (6:17-19), because these verses directly warn about the dangers of money, offering advice for the wealthy so that they may "lay hold of eternal life" (6:12).

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This week (September 26-29) I will be away participating in the Annual Convocation for priests in the Diocese of San Diego. This year nearly 175 priests, active and retired, diocesan and religious, who are currently ministering in the Diocese of San Diego will be gathering for this event. The convocation is a combination of prayer, spiritual reflection and some business. One of the things I enjoy most about the Convocation is the opportunity to gather with my brother priests and hear about the good things that are happening throughout our diocese in the many parishes and other faith communities. I am grateful for Sister Mary Kiely who has generously agreed to lead communion services Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of this week in place of our normal morning mass.

As you may recall, last spring our parish participated in our Diocesan Synod as part of the Universal Synod that Pope Francis is preparing for 2024. The summary of our diocesan participation can be found on the diocesan web site. During the 1,100 small-group meetings, a note-taker was assigned to each group to record as accurately as possible individuals' responses to the three foundational questions of the joys, the sorrows and the hopes that people found in the Church. In the subsequent process of analyzing the fruits of these small-group dialogues, four individuals read through a representative sample of recorder notes and collaboratively generated coding categories that were applicable to what they had read. The codes were used to analyze the meeting notes from sample parishes using a multiple-variation sampling strategy. Then all 1,100 sets of notes were examined. From this analysis eight central themes emerged. Four of them centered upon the joys participants found in the Church. Four of them focused on the challenges participants found in the life of our local church. I would like to share with you the first of those themes: Joys- 1. The Sacramental Life of the Church: The principal joy that emerged in the synodal sessions was participation in the sacramental life of the Church. The declaration of one participant that "experiencing the beauty of our Church/ Mass with our families is what brings us hope" was emblematic of comments in virtually every small-group sharing. Participants rejoiced in the fundamental nature of the Eucharist, pointing out that "you can attend Mass anywhere in the world and it's the same." A very large number of participants mentioned how the music in the liturgy brought great emotion and spiritual depth into their lives. One participant's comment summarized this joy in the Eucharist: "I love the peace I feel when I go to Mass. It's a chance to really speak to God and find rest."

The other sacraments were frequently mentioned as a source of joy as well. In these comments, participants frequently referred to specific sacramental moments that had been meaningful in their lives, rather than a generalized sense of sacramentality. Baptisms constitute a time of deep grace in the life of the faithful, as do celebrations of First Eucharist and weddings. One individual expressed this reality: "experiencing these sacraments in our lives and the lives of our children brings a lot of joy."
