"Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times." Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the scriptures:

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes'?

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit. (Matthew 21:33-43)



A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

God's relationship with people is at the heart of both the first reading and the Gospel, but there is a difference. In Isaiah, destruction comes to the vineyard; in the Gospel, it comes to those entrusted with the care of the vineyard.

Isaiah's song highlights the people's failure—the house of Israel and the people of Judah—to bear fruit, to provide the Lord who has lovingly tended this vineyard with anything more than wild grapes, that is, bloodshed and violence against each other. Because of this, the owner will turn his back on them, no longer giving care but letting it be trampled underfoot, no longer pruning or hoeing, but allowing thorns and briars to take over. This song is demanding conversion.

In Jesus' parable, the focus is on those entrusted with the care of the vineyard. Jesus addresses the chief priests and the elders in Jerusalem, not only criticizing their failure to care for the people adequately, but also their rejection of those God sent to call them to conversion. The parable calls all religious leaders to remember that authority is for service.

Bearing fruit in our lives, being true and honorable, just and pure, lovely and gracious is the fruit God desires from all, as Paul reminds the Philippians. God's people, but especially their leaders, have a responsibility to bear fruit. No one is let off the hook. God expects a return for love so lavishly given.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As you are aware approximately two years ago Pope Francis announced that he was calling for a worldwide Synod on the role that "Synodality" plays in the life of the Church. In preparation for this Synod every diocese throughout the world has held listening session with the Catholics of its diocese to surface areas of discernment and dialogue in the Church as it moves forward in time. It was in keeping with this request that last March our parish held its own listening sessions and submitted its results to be included in the Synod report for our diocese.

This universal gathering of Cardinals, bishops, priests, religious women and men as well as laypersons called to participate in the Universal Synod began in Rome this week (October 4th) and will run through the end of October. Cardinal McElroy is the representative to the synod from our diocese and therefore will be in Rome until the end of October.

Literally speaking the word "synod", derived from two Greek words syn meaning "together" and hodos meaning "road" or "way", means a "coming together". A Synod is a religious meeting or assembly at which bishops, gathered around and with the Holy Father, have opportunity to interact with each other and to share information and experiences, in the common pursuit of pastoral solutions, which have a universal validity and application. The Synod, generally speaking, can be defined as an assembly of bishops representing the Catholic episcopate, having the task of helping the Pope in the governing of the universal Church by rendering their counsel. Pope John Paul II has referred to the Synod as "a particularly fruitful expression and instrument of the collegiality of bishops".

Even before the Second Vatican Council, the idea was growing for a structure, which might provide the bishops with the means to assist the Pope in some manner to be determined, in his governing of the universal Church.

Let us keep the work of the Synod in our prayers over the next several weeks as we pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the Synod participants in identifying the call of the Church in this new millennium.

It is not too late; our parish faith formation programs are beginning again. Registration is continuing for our grade school Religious Education program. Registration for the High School Confirmation program is ongoing. Our R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) program for adults wishing to become Catholic or those who have been baptized but wish to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation takes place on Sundays at 10:15am in the St. Francis Room. We live in a time when politicians, heads of corporations, bankers, and others have acted with outrageous greed and selfishness, and there have been devastating consequences. Add to that the troubles in our Church, and we wonder if there has ever been a worse time than this. The answer is yes: in the fourteenth century the bubonic plague killed half the population of Europe; in 1960, forty million people died of famine in China. The list of violent, tyrannical rulers stretches from the Roman Emperor Caligula and Ivan the Terrible to Hitler, Stalin, and Mao Tse Tung. The world harbors all kinds of evil, and nowadays we hear about it very fast. But there is much more room for hope than we might think. Matthew was writing his Gospel for a community of Jewish Christians whose new faith set them apart from other Jews. All were living under the oppressive rule of Roman conquerors. The vineyard Matthew speaks of is like the world. God resembles the landowner, who created it and made it fruitful. So who are the evil tenants? For Matthew's community it was these Jewish leaders who grasped at power, collaborated with Rome, and cooperated in the killing of God's Son. But the Kingdom cannot be taken by force, and those who wreak havoc in God's world will face God's justice in this life or the next. In the meantime, it is our task to tend the Lord's vineyard. We can each contribute, from the smallest deeds of charity in our own daily lives, to exercising morality and ethics in the work place, to acting as responsible citizens, and striving to welcome and love the forgotten, the lost, and the most oppressed among us. Never lose heart and never give up; the Kingdom is ours.
