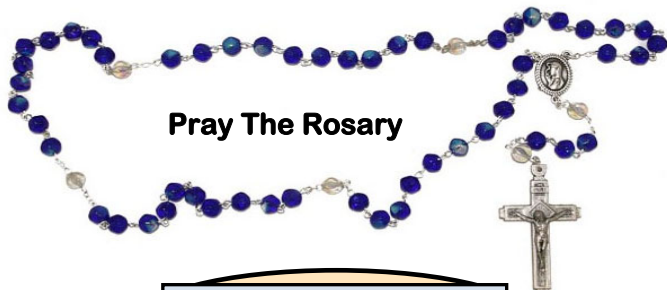

When Jan's son and his buddies were given two weeks' notice to move out of their house, Jan proposed that they throw a cleaning/moving party. She provided the food, drinks, and cleaning supplies. They provided the music and the muscle. The party was a great success. The house got cleaned, the move was completed in one afternoon, and everyone went home happy. Later that week a thank-you card arrived from one of her son's housemates. "Thanks for the party, Jan. We couldn't have done it without you. You're the greatest. Adam."

Do we take the time to reflect back on each day or do we just keep moving on? Do we recognize the healing in our lives or focus only on the suffering? Do we realize that "we couldn't have done it without" God or do we attribute our successes to good luck or our own hard work? Do we, like Naaman and the Samaritan leper, make it a habit to express our thanks to God in public praise and in lives of service?

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

The month of November is fast approaching and once again, this year we would like to remember all of our beloved deceased. If you would like to have a picture of your loved one placed in the church as we have done in the past, there is a box in the entrance of the church to receive copies of photos, which will be displayed. Also, in the next few weeks envelopes will be available for those who may wish to enroll a departed loved one in our All Souls Novena of Masses. You may drop your envelope in the basket on Sunday or return them directly to our parish office by Monday, October 31st.

This coming Monday our nation celebrates Columbus Day and so I thought it might be good to be reminded of the origins of this celebration and in particular the role that Catholic organizations played in its beginnings. "The first recorded celebration of Columbus Day in the United States took place on October 12, 1792. Organized by The Society of St. Tammany, also known as the Columbian Order, it commemorated the 300th anniversary of Columbus's landing. The 400th anniversary of the event, however, inspired the first official Columbus Day holiday in the United States. In 1892, President Benjamin Harrison issued a proclamation urging Americans to mark the day. The public responded enthusiastically, organizing school programs, plays, and community festivities across the country. Over the following decades, the Knights of Columbus, lobbied state legislatures to declare October 12 a legal holiday. Colorado was the first state to do so on April 1, 1907. New York declared Columbus Day a holiday in 1909 and on October 12, 1909, New York Governor Charles Evans Hughes led a parade that included the crews of two Italian ships, several Italian-American societies, and legions of the Knights of Columbus. Since 1971 Columbus Day, designated as the second Monday in October, has been celebrated as a federal holiday. In many locations across the country Americans parade in commemoration of the day."

In the next few weeks, as we approach the national elections in November, we will be experiencing an ever increasing amount of information on politicians and political issues. Therefore, with this in mind, I wish to continue to share with you brief passages from *Faithful Citizenship Civic Responsibility for a New Millennium* a Statement on Political Responsibility by the Administrative Board of the U.S. Catholic Bishops. The Bishops wrote: "Building peace, combating poverty and despair, and protecting freedom and human rights are not only moral imperatives; they are wise national priorities. Given its enormous power and influence in world affairs, the United States has a special responsibility to ensure that it is a force for justice and peace beyond our borders. 'Liberty and justice for all' is not only a profound national pledge; it is a worthy goal for our nation in its role as world leader."

Free of Fear

In today's readings lepers are cured: one through the prophet Elisha and ten by Jesus. For centuries lepers were total outcasts, compelled to live apart with other sufferers. Death did not come quickly to lepers, and loneliness and hunger were often worse than the disease. They survived by begging. Imagine the joy of these sufferers who are suddenly made well, and who can now slip back into normal life. Only two of these lepers caused to offer thanks. Neither of them were "sons of Israel." Naaman at first tried to give the prophet Elisha a gift to show his gratitude, which Elisha refused. Both Naaman and the Samaritan in the Gospel realized that the power of the God of Israel had freed them, not only from their physical suffering, but also from the isolation and fear that went along with it. For that they were truly grateful and said so.

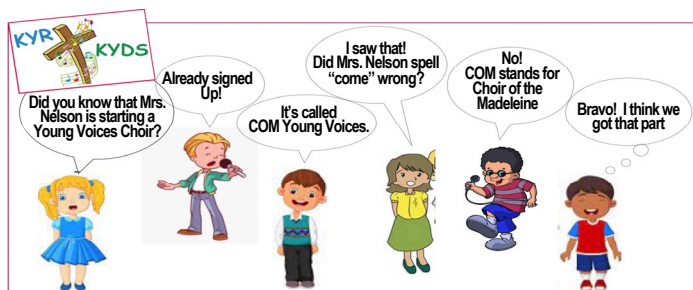
