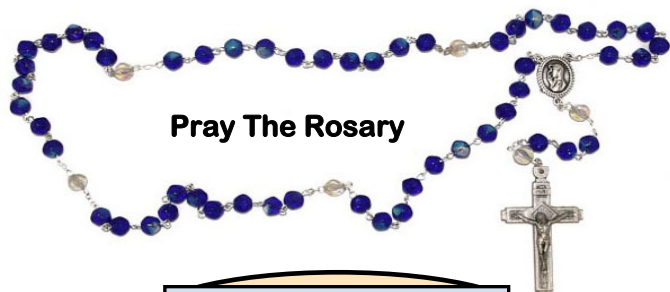

Reflecting on God's Word

My house shares a back yard with four college students. Ryan is one of them. Every morning the first thing Ryan does is go out the back door with a bagful of nuts and feed the squirrels. They hang out in our apple tree the way teenagers hang out around malls. One of the squirrels has become particularly bold and now waits expectantly for Ryan right at the back door. Lately the squirrel won't go away, no matter the time of day, no matter who's in the back yard. The squirrel just won't leave, nuts or no nuts, people or no people. Because it's become pesky, I now ignore the squirrel most of the time. Though Ryan doesn't, I do. Nevertheless, the squirrel is slowly getting my attention. Over the course of my lifetime, God is getting my attention, too.

People tend to hear this week's Gospel parable about the widow who keeps knocking on the judge's door as a story about God who eventually gives in to the widow. I think it's more a story about me eventually giving in to God. I hope God's not offended by being compared to a squirrel, but God is much more like the squirrel (or the widow) than like the judge. God's the one who does the pleading, it seems to me. While the parable seems to say, "Don't lose heart; God will eventually hear and answer," perhaps it's really saying, "Don't lose heart; God will not give up knocking on your door."

I am grateful to the members of the parish finance council who have worked to bring this to our community, in particular Mrs. Katie Moreno our parish Business Manager. One of the things you may notice is that last fiscal year we continued to benefit from the government PPP loan. Without this additional financial resource, our parish would be in difficult financial position. Your ongoing support and generosity are much appreciated.

Our religious education program along with our youth program are hosting a parish Fall Festival on the afternoon of Sunday October 30th from 2:00pm-5:30pm. It will include face painting, pumpkin carving, crafts, music and much more. I hope you will join us for this community building event.

The month of November is fast approaching and once again, this year we would like to remember all of our beloved deceased. If you would like to have a picture of your loved one displayed in the church there is a box in the entrance of the church to receive a copies of photos. Also, in the next few weeks envelopes will be available for those who may wish to enroll a departed loved one in our All Souls Novena of Masses. You may drop your envelope in the basket on Sunday or return them directly to our parish office by Monday, October 31st .

In the next few weeks, as we approach the national elections in November, we will be experiencing an ever increasing amount of information on politicians and political issues. Therefore, with this in mind, I wish to continue to share with you brief passages from *Faithful Citizenship Civic Responsibility for a New Millennium* a Statement on Political Responsibility by the Administrative Board of the U.S. Catholic Bishops. The Bishops wrote: "Building peace, combating poverty and despair, and protecting freedom and human rights are not only moral imperatives; they are wise national priorities. Given its enormous power and influence in world affairs, the United States has a special responsibility to ensure that it is a force for justice and peace beyond our borders. 'Liberty and justice for all' is not only a profound national pledge; it is a worthy goal for our nation in its role as world leader."

Folded Hands

"All we can do now is pray." We often say this when human efforts have failed, but it puts God in the place of last resort. In the Gospels, Jesus tells his disciples pray first, next, and last. Don't wait; call on God now, cry to God, tell God your problems. Believe that God hears you and looks on you with love. All prayers are answered: God says "yes," "no," or "wait." Perhaps your friend with cancer needs reconciliation with a family member more than a cure. Maybe the job that fell through for your son was a wrong turn. Your children may return to the Church when they have children. God sees the bigger picture. Prayer is not supposed to persuade God to give us exactly what we want; rather it is a means to rest our concerns and desires in the heart of God, who will give us all we need. Start with folded hands and an attitude of trust.

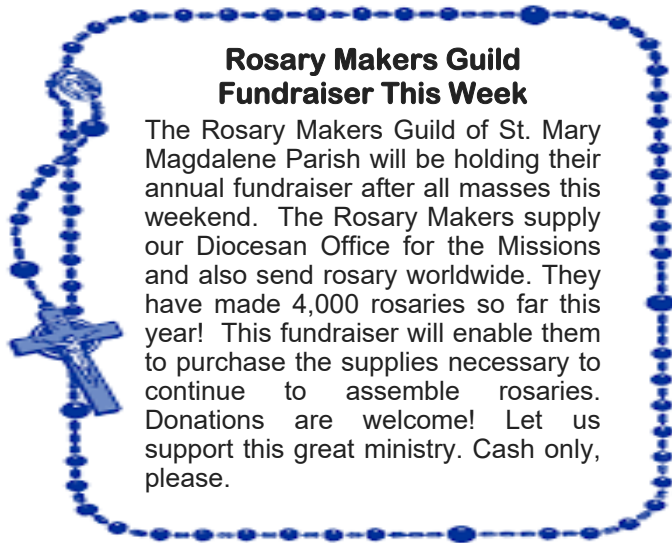
