Then some Sadducees, who assert that there is no resurrection, approached him and posed this question: "Teacher, Moses wrote down for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must marry his brother's wife and raise up children for his brother. Now there were seven brothers. The first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married the widow, and it was the same with all seven: they all died leaving no children. Last of all, the woman also died. Now at the resurrection, whose wife will the woman be, inasmuch as all seven had her?"

Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and are given in marriage, but those who are judged worthy of taking part in the age to come and in the resurrection of the dead will neither marry nor be given in marriage. They are no longer subject to death, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are children of the resurrection. (Luke 20: 27 - 36)

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

We have many hungers in life, and sometimes we can overindulge in response to them. Still, one that never goes away is our hunger to be connected. We desperately shun living in isolation. For many it is marriage that feeds that hunger, but so do family or friendships or the simple attention one finds in a community of faith or a collection of back yards. They all seem to feed our yearning for deep life, even when we are inattentive or preoccupied. A person of faith might even say that these communities are God being faithful to us.

This week's Gospel is one that turns the tables on us. It snares us in our own curiosity about what heaven will be like, and whether we will know the ones we love and be with our spouses, and what if we've been married seven times? And that's just where Jesus turns the tables and says it's about relationships and not about bodies to be with; it's about our deepest hungers to be united, even beyond marriage and friends and neighbors and communities of any sort. That's what resurrection is about, Jesus replies, and then reminds us one more time (as if we'd been deaf all the other times) that God has promised it and God is faithful. God "is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive," is how Luke has Jesus saying it (Luke 20:38). In other words, all of our relationships of loving and caring, especially those of marriage, are but hints of real and full life, and the best is yet to come. So what you've found in marriage, even if you've been married seven times, is just the beginning.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who helped to make our Fall Festival a rousing success. A special thank you goes out to our youth ministry who, under the guidance of Mrs. Kia Scott our Youth Minister, put together such a great afternoon.

This weekend we welcome Father Kizito Ndugbu, a priest from Nigeria who will be in residence at St. Mary Magdalene. Father Kizito is a member of the religious order of the Sons of Mary, Mother of Mercy. He was ordained in 2011 and has served in a number of positions within his community. Father Kizito will be working full time as a chaplain for Scripps-Mercy hospital and will be assisting us on weekends and some weekdays. I am sure you will welcome him as warmly as you welcomed me.

This, Monday, November 7th is the patronal feast of San Diego de Alcalá de Henares, also known as St. Didacus. San Diego was born about 1400 at San Nicholas in Andalusia, of poor and God-Fearing parents. He entered the Third Order of St. Francis as a young man and spent several years as a hermit. Later he entered the Franciscan convent in Castile and was admitted to solemn vows as a lay brother. After a few years he was sent as a missionary to the Canary Islands and went on to become the guardian of the chief friary on the islands at Fortaventura. He returned to Spain and was sent to Rome in 1450 to attend the great jubilee and the canonization ceremonies of St. Bernardine of Siena. While he was in Rome an epidemic broke out. Diego attended the sick with great charity and trust in God. Despite the lack of supplies in the city at the time, Diego always had ample provision for his patients. He miraculously restored many of them to health by making the Sign of the Cross over them. He would eventually return to Spain and when he felt that the end of his life was drawing near, he asked for an old and worn-out habit, so that he might die in it as a true son of St. Francis. He died on November 12, 1463, at the Franciscan monastery Alcalá, pressing a crucifix to his heart and repeating the words of the Good Friday chant: "Precious the wood, precious the nails, precious the weight they bear." He was canonized by Pope Sixtus V, in 1588.

This week is, of course, our national election and so as the election draws near the Bishops of the United States remind us: "The Catholic community is large and diverse.
