FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

These days I live in what had been for well over a hundred years a parish convent for the sisters who once taught in the parish's grade school. Like every old house it has creaks and clatters and clicks that ricochet about at nighttime and never seem to be heard in the daytime house. And because all of us who live here are adults, we say it's just the noises of an old house bedding down for a sleep—until one of us is home alone at night. Then, when the others return, we rush to tell them how Mother Caroline was up and around again. The dark does crazy things to our imaginations and makes us act and think like kids.

The dark has a way of flaunting itself with fearsome noises and sowing mysterious unknowns. And when not only our bodies but also our very lives find themselves in the dark, when we don't know how best to deal with disciplining our children, or where to direct the rest of our lives, or how to manage a relationship, well, such darkness can seem unbearable. Then the dark is too much with us.

We're never quite sure what mysterious unknowns our God might raise up out of the dark. That may also be why each of us in our own crazy way tries to befriend the dark's noises. We say they're the sounds of an old house, or the day cooling down, or the furnace kicking in, or we say it's Mother Caroline. One way or another we find a way to live with the darkness, for who knows what our God, the divine potter of the reading from Isaiah, may yet do with the damp clay of our lives?

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This week we begin a new liturgical year by entering into the season of Advent. During this season we look forward in three ways: we look forward to a celebration of the birthday of Christ on Christmas day; we look forward to a new spiritual birth of Christ in our lives; and we also look forward to the second coming of Christ. During Advent, we place ourselves in union with the people of the Old Testament by longing for the coming of Christ and we share their spirit of hoping and longing for the coming of salvation into the lives of God's people.

The most common symbol during the season of Advent is the Advent wreath. It is part of our long-standing Catholic tradition. However, the actual origins are uncertain. There is evidence of pre-Christian Germanic peoples using wreaths with lit candles during the cold and dark December days as a sign of hope in the future warm and extended-sunlight days of Spring. By the Middle Ages, the Christians adapted this tradition and used Advent wreaths as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas. The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. A tradition is that each week represents one thousand years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, which is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent. The light again signifies Christ, the Light of the world. The tradition of the Advent Wreath is not reserved for Sundays at Church but I encourage every family to make or purchase their own and use it as a form of family prayer, perhaps before the evening meal or before bed.

We have a number of important celebrations during our Advent season. We will celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day, on Friday, December 8th with masses at 7:45am and 6:00pm. Then our parish celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which will take place on Thursday, December 14th at 7:00pm. Also, on December 17th at 12:00pm, our Religious Education program will put on a Nativity play for the parish community. So put on your holiday best and mark your calendars for all these wonderful events.

STEWARDSHIP

On Guard

The author of Saint Mark's Gospel was what we call a straight shooter. His writing style is plain, with no elaboration or sophistication. In today's Gospel reading he gets right to the point: be on your guard; stay awake; the Lord must not find you asleep when he arrives. Advent comes from the Latin word *advenire*, which means "to come to." The season of Advent, then, is a time to think about and to reflect on three advents in particular: God's coming into the world as a human child, God's coming into our world today, and God's glorious coming at the end of time. These reflect three promises: God's promise to bring salvation to all people, Jesus' promise to be with those who follow him, and Jesus' further promise to return at the end of time. It is not enough simply to admire Jesus and be impressed by what he says. We are asked to take the extra step and follow the way of discipleship. We do not know where the path of discipleship will lead us, or when Christ himself will return. In the meantime we are the gatekeepers, the stewards, and the ones left in charge. Our responsibility is to stay alert and focused, even when others seem to be asleep or distracted, so that we are ready to welcome Christ into the world when he comes again. We are also asked to be attentive to the coming of God into our lives today: in the sacrament of Christ's Body; in the unlikely guise of the homeless, the hungry, the prisoner, the addict in whom Christ appears before us; and in the Spirit who is within us. We are urged to live with hope in our hearts for Christ's final return.

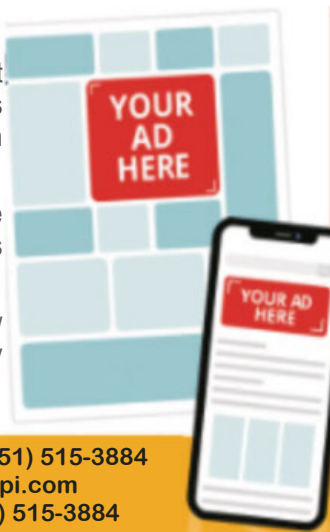
