ahead of you; he will prepare your way.


A voice of one crying out in the desert: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'"

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

How many towns do you suppose have a newspaper called *The Herald*? It's a good name for a newspaper because it refers to one who proclaims significant news. It also can refer to a person who comes before to announce what will follow, a forerunner like John. The angels who heralded the good news of Jesus' birth fit into a long line of heralds who proclaimed that God's promises would at last be fulfilled.

This week everyone seems to be announcing good news. Isaiah and the psalmist herald and describe others heralding glad tidings. Mark proclaims "the gospel [or 'good news'] of Jesus Christ" (Mark 1:1). He also depicts John as a herald in the tradition of Isaiah. And Peter speaks eloquently of God's promise and patience. Can we bring ourselves to hearken to their words and believe them? Do we have any good news of our own to proclaim?

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners.

This Tuesday, December 12th, is the celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This feast commemorates the appearance in 1531 of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Juan Diego, an Aztec convert, in Tepeyac, Mexico. The Blessed Mother asked that a shrine be built on the site of her appearance but the bishop at the time wanted a sign and so three days later she appeared again and asked Juan Diego to pick roses and take them to the bishop. He gathered them; and the Virgin arranged them herself in his tilma (cloak). When the roses were presented to the bishop, there on the tilma was the picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The church of Guadalupe, where this treasure is kept, is the world's most frequently visited Marian shrine.

The holiday season is a time when, in the exchange of gifts, we demonstrate our love for those who have touched us in special ways in our lives. Therefore, it is fitting that this weekend has been designated for the national collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. This appeal helps to ensure appropriate care and handicapped accessible housing for more than 37,000 Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests who are now past age 70. The crisis in unfunded retirement became evident in the early 1970s. Catholic schools, operated primarily by religious orders, were educating more than 10 percent of the student population in the United States. Catholic hospitals were becoming the largest group of not-for-profit hospitals in the nation. But the salaries and stipends to religious were earmarked primarily for good works, new ministries, and training and education that prepared religious for ministries. generations, the care of elderly members had been carried out by those entering religious life. however, elderly religious far out-number wage-earning religious. Retired religious today receive on average one-third of the benefit paid to the average Social Security recipient. Most church and diocesan pension plans do not cover religious institutes, which are organized independently. Health care costs have skyrocketed and the number of elderly religious in assisted living or nursing facilities has risen dramatically. I invite you to be as generous as possible in giving back to those who have given their lives in service of the gospel.

Each year during the season of Advent the Church calls us do penance in preparation for the Christmas season. We try to better our lives so that we might be more fully prepared to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Most often in parishes, this call to repentance is fulfilled by individual confessions and a parish penance service. This year our Parish Penance service will be on Thursday, December 14th at 7:00pm in the Church. We will have a couple of priests to assist us with this sacrament.

Are You Ready?

Some storytellers lead you gently into their tale by setting the scene, introducing characters, unfolding the plot, and building up tension toward a climax. Mark does not bother with such methods! In his Gospel there are no descriptions of Jesus' noble ancestry or of Mary's pregnancy or the birth in Bethlehem. There are no accounts of shepherds and wise men, wicked Herod or the journey into Egypt. The whole Gospel is summed up in the words of the very first sentence: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God" (Mark 1:1). The word gospel means "good news," and Mark brings a particular urgency to the message. The name Jesus is a version of the Hebrew name Joshua, "the Lord saves", and Christ is the Greek version of the Hebrew title Messiah, meaning "anointed one." Anointing was a sacred act usually conferred on kings. So here, in just one sentence, we are given good news: God is here to save the people through this anointed one, descendent of kings and a King himself. Jesus' arrival is announced by his cousin John, who is the "voice . . . crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3) also mentioned by the prophet Isaiah. Perhaps John the Baptist's own disciples are trying to convince John that he is the promised one, but John knows otherwise. He is not the Messiah; his task is to prepare the way. He is to baptize with water for the forgiveness of sins, but the one who is to come will give his life for the forgiveness of sins and will baptize his followers with the Holy Spirit. As we hear again about this coming Savior, the question we must ask ourselves is, are we ready to receive him? To receive him means being prepared to follow him and do his will.


