

Jesus is the One for whom the people have been patiently yet anxiously waiting, like the farmer who waits for the fruits of his labor. Jesus is the One for whom our hearts long.

#### THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

#### A Scriptural Reflection

#### **Reflecting on God's Word**

Joy is different from happiness. Happiness is a transient experience, but joy has more depth to it, more lasting roots. It can be independent of what is going on around us. In John's Gospel, the night before he died, Jesus says to his disciples that he wants his joy to be in them and their joy to be complete (John 15:11). And Paul writes to the Thessalonians: "Rejoice always" (2 Thessalonians 5:16).

Today's readings invite us to think about what brings us joy. Isaiah offers images of a world that will blossom or bloom, flowering into fullness. The prophet gives us wonderful images of dry, parched land suddenly breaking into a colorful display of new and abundant life.

This fullness also results from something being restored that had been lost or that was missing from the start: sight, hearing, being able to sing and leap with joy, health of body and spirit. Such fullness comes from God. It is gift, pure and simple.

God wants us to have this fullness of life, to be sure. It will come with the coming of the Lord. In the meantime, we are to wait patiently, not complaining, but with hearts marked by certitude. We have assurance in that we have already been welcomed into the kingdom at our baptism. The rest is only a matter of time. In speaking of John as more than a prophet, Jesus concludes by saying, "Yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he" (Matthew 11:11).

#### Dear Parishioners,

Today is Gaudete Sunday! Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "Rejoice!" The first two readings are filled with images of joy and comfort. They reassure us that God is near and always desires good things for us. Lasting joy comes not from status, possessions, and power, but from a life lived in the peace of God. As we get closer to Christmas, the pressure increases to buy more, spend more, eat more, do more. It requires great discipline to say "Enough!"

Tomorrow, December 12th is the celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This feast commemorates the appearance in 1531of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Juan Diego, an Aztec convert, in Tepeyac, Mexico. The Blessed Mother asked that a shrine be built on the site of her appearance but the bishop at the time wanted a sign and so three days later she appeared again and asked Juan Diego to pick roses and take them to the bishop. He gathered them; and the Virgin arranged them herself in his tilma (cloak). When the roses were presented to the bishop, there on the tilma was the picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The church of Guadalupe, where this treasure is kept, is the world's most frequently visited Marian shrine.

Next Saturday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, Chris Bongato, who has been working with us as a seminarian will be ordained to the diaconate. The ordination will take place at Mater Dei Parish in Chula Vista beginning at 10:00am. This celebration is open to the public and I encourage as many of our parishioners as possible to attend this wonderful event.

The holiday season is a time when, in the exchange of gifts, we demonstrate our love for those who have touched us in special ways in our lives. Therefore, it is fitting that this weekend has been designated for the national collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. This appeal helps to ensure appropriate care and handicapped accessible housing for more than 37,000 Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests who are now past age 70. The crisis in unfunded retirement became evident in the early 1970s. Catholic schools, operated primarily by religious orders, were educating more than 10% of the student population in the United States. Catholic hospitals were becoming the largest group of not-for-profit hospitals in the nation. But the salaries and stipends to religious were earmarked primarily for good works, new ministries, and training and education that prepared religious for ministries. For generations, the care of elderly members had been carried out by those entering religious life. Today, however, elderly religious far outnumber wage-earning religious.

Retired religious today receive on average one-third of the benefit paid to the average Social Security recipient. Most church and diocesan pension plans do not cover religious institutes, which are organized independently.

Health care costs have skyrocketed and the number of elderly religious in assisted living or nursing facilities has risen dramatically. I invite you to be as generous as possible in giving back to those who have given their lives in service of the gospel.

Each year during the season of Advent the Church calls us do penance in preparation for the Christmas season. We try to better our lives so that we might be more fully prepared to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Most often in parishes, this call to repentance is fulfilled by individual confessions and a parish penance service. This year our Parish Penance service will be on Thursday, December 15<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm in the Church. We will have a couple of priests to assist us with this sacrament.
