Reflecting on God's Word

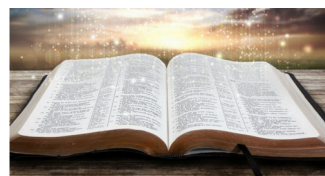
When Israel packed its few bags and went rushing out of Egypt, God's chosen people began a journey into being a new creation, from being a nation of slaves to being a nation of free men and women, a people under the heel of Egypt to one joined to God by the covenant, a community that ate manna (which literally means "What is it?") to one that ate the produce of the promised land. This journey took forty years and it wasn't easy.

When the prodigal son finally "came to his senses" and realized he would be better off back home as a hired worker than stealing slop from the pigs, he began a journey from being lost to being found, from being dead to being alive. This journey did not take forty years, but how do you measure in clock time a journey that transforms the heart? This journey wasn't easy either.

The path to being a new creation can take forty years, forty days, forty minutes, or forty seconds. Sometimes it involves an outer journey; it is always an inner one. It is difficult—dying to self always is. What matters is that we make it. Because the end result is the radiance of a people, or a son or daughter, who has finally arrived where they belong, at a party where the Father has an arm around them and the older brother who brought this about through his saving death is standing at the Father's side, with the Spirit hovering above them all.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

Each year all parishes in the Diocese of San Diego are asked to participate in the Annual Lenten Collection. This collection raises funds for the Church in places other than the United States, places like Latin America, where the Church is still recovering from numerous natural disasters, and places like the Holy Land, the birthplace of our faith. Envelopes for this collection can be found on the counter at the back of the church and we invite you to be as generous as possible. You may indicate on the envelope if you would like to designate your contribution to one or more of the four causes included in this collection.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops recently released the following statement regarding the Ukraine: In union with the Holy See, we call for the immediate cessation of Russia's armed aggression and unprovoked war on Ukraine that has already exacted a staggering toll - thousands dead and an exodus of three million refugees - with no end in sight. We join our plea with that of the Holy Father on March 13 when he said, "In the name of God, listen to the cry of those who suffer, and put an end to the bombings and the attacks!" Similar appeals have been raised throughout the Orthodox Christian world and indeed by many Russians themselves. We are witnessing an unprecedented threat to world peace. This possibility of global warfare is compounded by the unthinkable consequences that would result from the potential use of nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction. We call on Catholics of the United States and all people of good will to pray for an end to this war in Ukraine and for peace based on justice and respect for international law. We remember always that prayer is never a feeble gesture of last resort! It is a weapon of hope. We continue to call on the U.S. government to aid humanitarian access and to support and provide assistance to those who remain in Ukraine and those fleeing the country. We call on all Americans to contribute generously and sacrificially to Catholic and other humanitarian agencies supporting these efforts. At this dark time, we are united with the suffering people of Ukraine. May Our Lady of Fatima and the patron saint of Kyiv, St. Michael the Archangel, guide all peoples in the pursuit of peace and watch over all those in the path of war.

Don't forget our Parish Lenten Penance Service which will take place on Tuesday, April 7th beginning at 6:30pm. We will have a number of priests from the neighboring parishes with us to assist with this celebration.

In 2007 Pope Benedict released his Apostolic Exhortation on the Eucharist entitled *Sacramentum Caritatis* (The Sacrament of Charity). In this letter the Holy Father wrote about the "why" and the "how" we as Church celebrate the Eucharist. I would like to begin with a passage that speaks about the importance of Sunday as the Lord's Day. The Holy Father wrote: The life of faith is endangered when we lose the desire to share in the celebration of the Eucharist and its commemoration of the paschal victory. Participating in the Sunday liturgical assembly with all our brothers and sisters, with whom we form one body in Jesus Christ, is demanded by our Christian conscience and at the same time it forms that conscience.

To lose a sense of Sunday as the Lord's Day, a day to be sanctified, is symptomatic of the loss of an authentic sense of Christian freedom, the freedom of the children of God. ...Sunday thus appears as the primordial holy day, when all believers, wherever they are found, can become heralds and guardians of the true meaning of time. It gives rise to the Christian meaning of life and a new way of experiencing time, relationships, work, life and death. On the Lord's Day, then, it is fitting that Church groups should organize, around Sunday Mass, the activities of the Christian community: social gatherings, programs for the faith formation of children, young people and adults, pilgrimages, charitable works, and different moments of prayer. For the sake of these important values – while recognizing that Saturday evening, beginning with First Vespers, is already a part of Sunday and a time when the Sunday obligation can be fulfilled – we need to remember that it is Sunday itself that is meant to be kept holy, lest it end up as a day "empty of God."
