

After six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

Two of today's readings take us up a mountain. Mountains are sacred places in the scriptures. Moses meets the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob on Mt. Sinai. Elijah has an experience of this same life-giving God on Mt. Horeb. Today Abraham goes up Mt. Moriah in obedience to God's command to "take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love" (Genesis 22:2) and offer him there as a holocaust.

It is hard to get past this reading today and focus only on the story of the Transfiguration. This story of God testing Abraham to see if Abraham will obey is a story of great anguish. "See" is an important word here: Moriah means "the place of seeing." Abraham responds to Isaac's question about a victim, saying God will provide, a word rooted in the Latin word for seeing. God will see to it that there is a victim, just as God will see that Abraham is obedient in all things.

Seeing also takes place on Mt. Tabor. Peter, James, and John see Jesus in glory, his clothes dazzlingly white; they see him speaking with Moses and Elijah, representing the law and the prophets; and they see a cloud overshadowing them, and hear a voice calling for their obedience: "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him" (Mark 9:7).

With them, we are invited to see Jesus as the beloved Son whom the Father "did not spare . . . but handed over for us all," as Paul reminds us (Romans 8:32). The mystery of the Cross and Resurrection is an invitation to see God's love for all God's beloved children and trust in it.—James A. Wallace, C. Ss. R.

Dear Parishioners,

We have begun our "journey to Jerusalem" and as we continue the season of Lent many people often ask about the regulations on the traditional disciplines of Fasting and Abstinence and so it may be helpful to note that the Church recommends that Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. In addition, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics from ages 18-59 are encouraged to fast, limiting themselves to one full meal and two small meals each day. Why abstain from meat on some days and not some other food? The reason is probably the simple fact that historically speaking meat was always a special food and a luxury; meat at every meal is an extremely recent phenomenon. even in this country. Consequently giving up something like this is giving up something "significant". Abstinence from meat has value to the extent that it is an act of self-denial. In general, the applicable principle is that we are expected, as followers of Christ, to "mature" as human beings spiritually. What the Church has in mind, however, is not simple emotional or even spiritual maturity but increasing one's likeness to Christ, whose life was one of habitual self-denial. For a conscientious Christian, this period of special abstinence is a time of building a more intense awareness of their dependence upon Christ, and, in addition, their obligation to share the goods of this world, with which they have been endowed by God, with

I would ask you to keep in prayer the more than 75 members of our school and religious education program whom this weekend celebrated the Rite of Reconciliation for the first time in preparation for their reception of First Eucharist. I am grateful to all those who are assisting in preparing these young people for this important moment in their lives.

As part of our Lenten Journey each Friday during lent we offer the stations of the cross beginning at 7:00pm in the church. Please note on Friday, March 1st, we will also host a Soup Supper prior to the Stations of the Cross. I hope as many as possible will be able to join us.

Pope John Paul II wrote about the season Lent with the following words: "Each year, the Lenten Season is set before us as a good opportunity for the intensification of prayer and penance, opening hearts to the docile welcoming of the divine will. During Lent, a spiritual journey is outlined for us that prepares us to relive the Great Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of Christ. This is done primarily by listening to the Word of God more devoutly and by practicing mortification more generously, thanks to which it is possible to render greater assistance to those in need."


