



Divine Mercy Sunday

As the faithful prepare to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, it is important to review the meaning and historical significance of the day. On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter be called "Divine Mercy Sunday."

St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received visions from Jesus, including one of Jesus wearing a white garment with beams of red and white coming from His heart, which came to be known as the image of Divine Mercy. She wrote in her diary that He said:

According to the vision, those who receive communion and attend confession on the Feast of Mercy receive total forgiveness of sins.

Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. As Pope John Paul II stated, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified."

Reflecting on God's Word

Once in a while I find myself in the pew at a liturgical celebration, and I confess I like to sit near the front and watch all the people as they come back from receiving Holy Communion. I know what all the books say about that, what my teachers taught, and what the priests I've listened to have preached. They said you're supposed to be praying, but I can't help it. I just like to watch all the folks. I think God may even like it as much as I do.

When I sit there watching them, I think about how we're all believers of one sort or another. George, who every week comes alone, without his family. And Melissa, who flirts with all the boys more than she should, and whose parents hardly ever seem to smile. And Mr. P., who always casts his eyes downward and folds his hands upward. And Agnes, who seems to have been caring for her aging mother for as long as anyone in the church can remember and who herself is now beginning to show signs of aging as well. And the lanky high schooler who must play basketball well, because he's certainly tall enough and wears a letter proudly on his school jacket. And Arthur, whose wife just died. And a couple hundred other believers as well. They're all here, every Sunday, and they're all part of the Body of Christ. It's also why I'm a believer, because they're believers; and most of the time I need them to be believers just so I can be a believer.

Thomas of this week's Gospel couldn't be a believer on his own. Having missed the Sunday gathering, he just couldn't say yes on his own. But one week later when he was there with all the others, that made all the difference in the world. In fact it made him a believer. So that's why I watch all the folks processing by after they receive Holy Communion. They make me a believer.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Our Holy Week and Easter celebrations would not have been possible without the hard work and dedication of so many in our parish. Therefore, I would once again like to thank in particular the members for their beautiful music, all who decorated our church so beautifully, and all those who helped behind the scenes to make our liturgies run smoothly.

This weekend, the Second Sunday of Easter, is observed throughout the Church as Divine Mercy Sunday. To encourage its celebration with special devotion, this Sunday has been enriched by a plenary indulgence which is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions:

- 1) Sacramental confession (satisfied this year by General Absolution which has already been granted)
- 2) Eucharistic communion
- 3) Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father.

The other conditions for the plenary indulgence will be included within all celebrations of the Eucharist in our parish on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Parish life is filled with transition. In case you have not already been made aware Mrs. Jean Coleman who has been a part of our school community for over twenty years, serving almost the last decade as the principal, has announced that she will be retiring at the end of this school year. We are grateful for her many years of ministry to our school and parish communities. Following an extensive search, a search committee comprising of both faculty and parents has selected Mrs. Dana Davalos as the next principal at School of the Madeleine. Dana has been serving as the vice principal for the last several years and we happy to welcome her to this new role in our community.

Secondly, I wish to thank Gerry Barlow who has been serving as our Director of Religious Education. Gerry graciously stepped in two years ago when our parish was in need and has done a wonderful job. Gerry will be stepping down from this position at the end of this academic year. I am grateful for her ministry in our parish and in particular for her work with our young people. We will be looking for someone to take over this ministry. If you know of a qualified candidate please have them review the job posting on the HR page of the Diocesan web site and then submit their resume to the parish office.

On Easter Morning Pope Francis spoke "To the City and to the World" when he proclaimed: *Christòs anesti*! "Christ is risen; he is truly risen!" In this traditional proclamation of the Churches of the East, the word "truly" reminds us that our hope is not an illusion, but the truth! And that, in the wake of Easter, humanity's journey, now marked by hope, advances all the more readily. The first witnesses of the resurrection show this by their example.

The Gospels speak of the haste with which, on the morning of Easter, the women "ran to tell the disciples" (Mt 28:8). Mary Magdalene "ran and went to Simon Peter" (Jn 20:2), while John and Peter himself then "ran together" (cf. v. 4) to the place where Jesus had been buried. Later, on the evening of Easter, after meeting the Risen Lord on the road to Emmaus, two disciples "set out without delay" (cf. Lk 24:33) and travelled several miles, uphill and in the dark, spurred on by the irrepressible joy of Easter that burned in their hearts (cf. v. 32). The same joy that led Peter, on the shore of the Lake of Galilee, after catching sight of the risen Jesus, to leave the boat with the others, to throw himself immediately into the water and to swim quickly towards him (cf. Jn 21:7). At Easter, then, the journey quickens and becomes a race, since humanity now sees the goal of its journey, the meaning of its destiny, Jesus Christ, and is called to make haste to meet him, who is the hope of the world. May we too make haste to progress on a journey of reciprocal trust: trust among individuals, peoples and nations. May we allow ourselves to experience amazement at the joyful proclamation of Easter, at the light that illumines the darkness and the gloom in which, all too often, our world finds itself enveloped. Let us make haste to surmount our conflicts and divisions, and to open our hearts to those in greatest need. Let us hasten to pursue paths of peace and fraternity. Let us rejoice at the concrete signs of hope that reach us from so many countries, beginning with those that offer assistance and welcome to all fleeing from war and poverty. At the same time, along this journey we also encounter many stumbling blocks, which make it more difficult and demanding to hasten towards the Risen Lord. To him, then, let us make our prayer: Lord, help us to run to meet you! Help us to open our hearts!

Empty

Andrew was born with mild Down Syndrome. He loved to go to religion class on Sunday. His classmates mostly ignored him. On the Sunday after Easter the teacher gave out plastic eggs, one to each child, and they went outside to find symbols of new life to put in the eggs. Back indoors the teacher opened the first egg: there was a beautiful flower. In the second was a butterfly and in the third a green leaf. The fourth was empty. The children said, "Somebody did it wrong." "It's mine," Andrew said. "I did do it right! The tomb is empty!" There was sudden silence. From that time on, Andrew became a part of the group, set free from the tomb of his difference. Andrew died last summer. During his funeral Mass, nine eight-year old children, together with their teacher, marched up to the altar, not with flowers to cover over the stark reality of death, but with an empty, old pantyhose egg, and placed it on the altar steps. The tomb is empty!




