



Reflecting on God's Word

Can you remember a time when you heard an *a cappella* choir sing in perfect harmony? Perhaps you have sung in a choir like that. The many voices blend into one voice, the many parts into unified chords, the many notes into a single song. If we can imagine that harmony for an instant, we might hear an echo of the perfect harmony uniting our one God. The three-part harmony in God sings a single song of love. It sings of the merciful, faithful love of the Father who nurtures and protects this weak, beloved human family. It sings of the self-giving love of Jesus that liberates us from slavishly repeating our sins. It sings of the unifying love of the Holy Spirit that binds us together in love and unity and peace.

As we imagine that harmonious hymn of praise, we might also hear a summons to live in the harmony that the Holy Spirit empowers in us. Our God's love is so powerful that it resounds in the Christian community and invites the whole world to sing along in the never-ending hymn of love.


As we celebrate Trinity Sunday today I would like to share with you a part of the Homily that Pope Benedict XVI gave on this great feast. The Holy Father proclaimed: Today we are celebrating the Feast of the Blessed Trinity, the Feast of God, of the center of our faith: God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. When one thinks of the Trinity, one usually thinks of the aspect of the mystery: they are Three and they are One, one God in three Persons. Actually God in his greatness cannot be anything but a mystery for us, yet he revealed himself. We can know him in his Son and thus also know the Father and the Holy Spirit. Instead today's Liturgy draws our attention not so much to this mystery as to the reality of love that is contained in this first and supreme mystery of our faith. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are one because God is love and love is an absolute life-giving force; the unity created by love is a unity greater than a purely physical unity. The Father gives everything to the Son; the Son receives everything from the Father with gratitude; and the Holy Spirit is the fruit of this mutual love of the Father and the Son. The texts of today's Mass speak of God and thus speak of love; they do not dwell so much on the three Persons, but rather on love which is the substance and, at the same time, the unity and trinity. You are called, in fact, to develop this precious deposit in one of the most crucial moments in history. Today your mission is facing profound and rapid cultural, social, economic and political transformations that have determined new directions and changed mentalities, customs and sensitivities. Here too, as elsewhere, there is no lack of difficulties and obstacles, due above all to hedonistic models that obscure minds and risk uprooting all morality. The temptation has crept in to believe that man's true wealth is not faith, but personal and social power, his intellect, his culture and his capacity to manipulate scientific, technological and social reality.

Thus, in these lands too, people have begun to replace faith and Christian values with presumed riches which ultimately prove to be inconsistent and unable to sustain the great promise of the true, the good, the beautiful and the just that for centuries your ancestors have identified with the experience of faith. Nor should we forget the crisis into which many families have been plunged, aggravated by the widespread psychological and spiritual fragility of couples, as well as the struggle experienced by many educators in offering formative continuity to young people, who are conditioned by various types of instability, and in the first place that of their social role and work opportunities.

Once again, this year we will be celebrating a novena of masses in honor of Father's Day. If you would like to enroll your father, living or deceased, in these masses please fill out an intention envelope and return it either in the Sunday basket or directly to the parish office by June 18th.



Three In One

Today we honor God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We believe that God is one being yet three distinct persons. Don't let the word "person" fool you; here it means "individual reality," not like a human person. How can the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit be distinct yet completely united? Well, think of your eyes: each is distinct, yet together they are one and undivided in their sight. Alternatively, think of Jesus as solid, like ice: he became fully human in our world. The Holy Spirit, like steam, is someone unseen, but with great power. The Father is like water, without which there would be neither steam nor ice. All these explanations fall short. The Trinity is a mystery; but "mystery" does not mean a riddle to be solved, but a reality beyond our human comprehension. It is a truth we can only begin to know through worship, symbol, and faith.
