But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

In the Northern Hemisphere the days are growing shorter, the nights longer. Nature seems to be entering a long winter's sleep. Something about the increasing darkness brings out our deepest weaknesses and fears. It lulls some of us into lethargy while luring others into evil. We may grow anxious about the dangers lurking in the dark and ultimately awaiting us at the end of life. All those fears and weaknesses come to the fore when a loved one is out in the dead of night, or slipping away into the darkness of eternal slumber. We stay awake and watchful. We keep vigil.

This week's scriptures invite us not to be drugged by the darkness that seems to grow around us and succumb to slumber, temptation, or fear. We are to keep vigil, but not like those "who have no hope" (1 Thessalonians 4:13). We are to stay awake, working and watchful, confidently expecting God's light to dawn at every new moment. We are to seek wisdom, keeping vigil for her (book of Wisdom), to thirst for the Lord through the night (Psalm 63), consoling one another (1 Thessalonians). Like the wise virgins, we are to be prepared for a long night of vigil. In the meantime we are to do the work entrusted to us, free from care and full of hope.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our nation celebrates Veterans Day in which we are invited to pause and offer thoughts and prayers of gratitude for the many men and women, past and present, who have served our nation in the Armed Services. In 1999, while speaking to a gathering of Military Chaplains, Pope John Paul II offered the following reflection regarding the good that these men and women accomplish: "In democratic societies there is a growing conviction that the Armed Forces are called to be instruments of peace and harmony among peoples and of support for the weakest. In this regard, how can we forget the numerous missions in which the Armed Forces were on the front lines in offering their generous help to peoples struck by natural calamities or humanitarian tragedies? How can we not admire the dangers and sacrifices that are faced by those who carry out peace-keeping missions in countries destroyed by senseless civil wars? With these interventions, the Armed Forces gain more and more credit as defenders of inalienable human values such as life, freedom, law and justice. This conception of military life is in harmony with the Gospel message that offers many pastoral opportunities for the Military Ordinariate Church."

Speaking of gratitude believe it or not the holidays will quickly be upon us. Our parish will celebrate on Thanksgiving morning with Mass at 9:00am I invite you to start your day by joining us.

Early in his pontificate, Saint John Paul II wrote about the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of the believer. I would like to share a part of that letter with you. The Holy Father wrote: Since therefore the Eucharist is the source of charity, it has always been at the center of the life of Christ's disciples. It has the appearance of bread and wine, that is to say of food and drink; it is therefore as familiar to people, as closely linked to their life, as food and drink. The veneration of God, who is love, springs, in Eucharistic worship, from that kind of intimacy in which He Himself, by analogy with food and drink, fills our spiritual being, ensuring its life, as food and drink do. This "Eucharistic" veneration of God therefore strictly corresponds to His saving plan. He Himself, the Father, wants the "true worshipers" to worship Him precisely in this way, and it is Christ who expresses this desire, both with His words and likewise with this sacrament in which He makes possible worship of the Father in the way most in conformity with the Father's will. From this concept of Eucharistic worship there then stems the whole sacramental style of the Christian's life. In fact, leading a life based on the sacraments and animated by the common priesthood means in the first place that Christians desire God to act in them in order to enable them to attain, in the Spirit, "the fullness of Christ himself."

God, on His part, does not touch them only through events and by this inner grace; He also acts in them with greater certainty and power through the sacraments. The sacraments give the lives of Christian's sacramental style. Now, of all the sacraments it is the Holy Eucharist that brings to fullness their initiation as Christians and confers upon the exercise of the common priesthood that sacramental and ecclesial form that links it, as we mentioned before to the exercise of the ministerial priesthood. In this way Eucharistic worship is the center and goal of all sacramental life. In the depths of Eucharistic worship we find a continual echo of the sacraments a Christian initiation: baptism and confirmation. Where better is there expressed the truth that we are not only "called God's children" but "that is what we are" by virtue of the sacrament of Baptism, if not precisely in the fact that in the Eucharist we become partakers of the body and blood of God's only Son? And what predisposes us more to be "true witnesses of Christ" before the world-as we are enabled to be by the sacrament of Confirmation-than Eucharistic Communion, in which Christ bears witness to us, and we to Him? But we must always take care that this great meeting with Christ in the Eucharist does not become a mere habit, and that we do not receive Him unworthily, that is to say, in a state of mortal sin. The practice of the virtue of penance and the sacrament of Penance are essential for sustaining in us and continually deepening that spirit of veneration which man owes to God Himself and to His love so marvelously revealed.
