THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

FEBRUARY 2, 2025



When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present

him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord," and to offer the sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons," in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

*"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."*

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted and you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

### Reflecting on God's Word

Have you ever noticed how church candles burn? Unlike our candles at home, they leave no wax behind. They slowly get shorter and shorter until they have been completely consumed by the flame. That is because they are made of pure beeswax, which burns hot and bright with all of the wax becoming fuel for the fire.

Today's candle ritual, like the Service of Light at the Easter Vigil, reminds us of the Light of the World that dawned at Christmas. Simeon rightly recognized that Jesus himself would have to become like pure wax. His sacrificial death would fuel the flame that burns brightly as a light of revelation to the Gentiles and glory for Israel.

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

A big thank you to all who helped to make last weekend's pancake breakfast such a success. We served about 400 meals. I am so grateful for those in the parish and in the school who gave so generously of their time for this wonderful event.

A reminder that next weekend is the Super Bowl and as has been our practice there will NOT be a 6:00pm mass next weekend (Feb. 9th).

This past week the Church celebrated the annual World Day for Consecrated Life. Consecrated life is a vocation, a call from God, to conform one's life to Jesus Christ through living as he did in poverty, chastity and obedience, dedicating oneself to God for service to the Church and for the salvation of the world. The most well known form of consecrated life, and that which is the prototype for the other forms, is religious life. In this form, men and women pronounce publicly the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, live in community, and share a common apostolate. The greatest numbers of religious are women, called sisters. Among the men, there are brothers, deacons and priests. Within religious life there are two general forms of living: active or apostolic and contemplative. While all religious have prayer as their first and foremost duty, apostolic institutes are actively involved in the works of the Church – education, health care, serving the poor. Contemplative religious, however, spend a major portion of their day in prayer, separating themselves from the world in order to offer their prayers and sacrifices for the needs of the Church and the world. Through the years our parish has been blessed by the prayer, work and sacrifice of many religious let us continue to pray for them and for their various ministries.

For our reflection this week I share with you a passage from Pope Francis Encyclical *Fratelli Tutti (On Fraternity and Social Friendship)*. The Holy Father wrote: True wisdom demands an encounter with reality. Today, however, everything can be created, disguised and altered. A direct encounter even with the fringes of reality can thus prove intolerable. A mechanism of selection then comes into play, whereby I can immediately separate likes from dislikes, what I consider attractive from what I deem distasteful. In the same way, we can choose the people with whom we wish to share our world. Persons or situations we find unpleasant or disagreeable are simply deleted in today's virtual networks; a virtual circle is then created, isolating us from the real world in which we are living. The ability to sit down and listen to others, typical of interpersonal encounters, is paradigmatic of the welcoming attitude shown by those who transcend narcissism and accept others, caring for them and welcoming them into their lives. Yet "today's world is largely a deaf world... At times, the frantic pace of the modern world prevents us from listening attentively to what another person is saying.

Halfway through, we interrupt him and want to contradict what he has not even finished saying. We must not lose our ability to listen". Saint Francis "heard the voice of God, he heard the voice of the poor, he heard the voice of the infirm and he heard the voice of nature. He made of them a way of life. My desire is that the seed that Saint Francis planted may grow in the hearts of many". As silence and careful listening disappear, replaced by a frenzy of texting, this basic structure of sage human communication is at risk. A new lifestyle is emerging, where we create only what we want and exclude all that we cannot control or know instantly and superficially. This process, by its intrinsic logic, blocks the kind of serene reflection that could lead us to a shared wisdom. Together, we can seek the truth in dialogue, in relaxed conversation or in passionate debate. To do so calls for perseverance; it entails moments of silence and suffering, yet it can patiently embrace the broader experience of individuals and peoples. The flood of information at our fingertips does not make for greater wisdom. Wisdom is not born of quick searches on the internet nor is it a mass of unverified data. That is not the way to mature in the encounter with truth. Conversations revolve only around the latest data; they become merely horizontal and cumulative. We fail to keep our attention focused, to penetrate to the heart of matters, and to recognize what is essential to give meaning to our lives. Freedom thus becomes an illusion that we are peddled, easily confused with the ability to navigate the internet. The process of building fraternity, be it local or universal, can only be undertaken by spirits that are free and open to authentic encounters.

### Candlemas

Today's Gospel tells how Jesus is presented in the temple for ceremonies proper to a firstborn son. He is recognized as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" by the prophet Simeon (Luke 2:32), and his power is proclaimed by the prophetess Anna. Many Americans have never heard of Candlemas, this day's alternate name; they know it as Groundhog Day, a custom begun by Pennsylvania German immigrants. Candlemas began in Europe for the blessing of candles for church and home use. In the centuries when candles were the only source of light, people were well aware of the powers of darkness, both literally and symbolically. For us, accustomed to the flip of a switch, the most compelling experience of light transforming darkness is at the Easter Vigil. The lighted Easter candle enters a darkened church, "Christ our Light" is proclaimed three times, and the light is passed from candle to candle among the people.

**Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: FEBRUARY 3, 2025**

**YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO**

On June 17, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego, sometimes referred to as The Diocese of San Diego (“Debtor”) filed for protection under chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the “Bankruptcy Code”).

**If you were sexually abused by any person connected with Debtor, you must file a claim so as to be received by February 3, 2025, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Debtor. Even if you have already filed a lawsuit against Debtor alleging abuse you must still file a claim to maintain and/or preserve your rights.**

**Claims based on acts or omissions of the Debtor that occurred before June 17, 2024, must be filed on or before February 3, 2025, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before June 17, 2024.**
