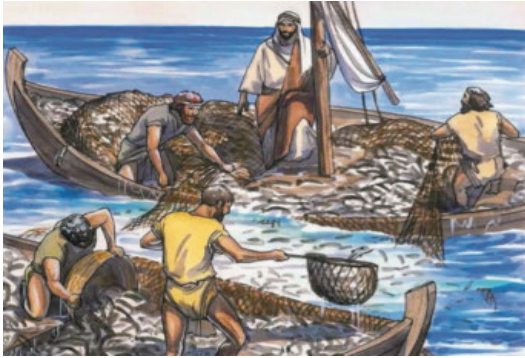

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FEBRUARY 9, 2025



While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

Reflecting on God's Word

We are all familiar with the story of *The Wizard of Oz*. There's Dorothy, who wants to get back to Kansas. There's the Cowardly Lion, who's looking for courage. There's the Scarecrow, who's looking for a brain because some crow told him he was stupid and he believed it. And there's the Tin Woodsman, who's trying to find a heart in order to demonstrate some sensitivity. They all go to see the Wizard, who proves to be a fraud.

But as the story unfolds, you discover who's the most courageous one in the group. It's the Lion called cowardly. Who thinks up the best ideas? It's the Scarecrow who supposedly has no brain. Who is it that shows the most compassion? It's the heartless Tin Woodsman. And Dorothy? She's never left Kansas at all; it's only a dream. They come to realize that only after the Wizard of Oz calls it to their attention.

Many people do not realize how gifted and talented they really are. Many ordinary individuals do not know that there's a giant hidden within them. What's needed are Wizards to call it to their attention.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates "World Marriage Sunday" focusing in particular on the vocation of married life. Therefore, I offer for your reflection a brief passage from Pope John Paul II 1981 encyclical *Familiaris Consortio* when he wrote: The gift of Jesus Christ is not exhausted in the actual celebration of the sacrament of marriage, but rather accompanies the married couple throughout their lives. This fact is explicitly recalled by the Second Vatican Council when it says that Jesus Christ "abides with them so that, just as He loved the Church and handed Himself over on her behalf, the spouses may love each other with perpetual fidelity through mutual self-bestowal.... For this reason, Christian spouses have a special sacrament by which they are fortified and receive a kind of consecration in the duties and dignity of their state. By virtue of this sacrament, as spouses fulfill their conjugal and family obligations, they are penetrated with the Spirit of Christ, who fills their whole lives with faith, hope and charity. Thus they increasingly advance towards their own perfection, as well as towards their mutual sanctification, and hence contribute jointly to the Glory of God."....

Friday is also Valentine's Day and therefore I thought it might be good to know what the Church has to say about Saint Valentine. The classic text *Butler's Lives of the Saints* describes St. Valentine as "a holy priest in Rome, who, with St. Marius and his family, assisted the martyrs in the persecution under Claudius II. He was apprehended, and sent by the emperor to the prefect of Rome, who, on finding all his promises to make him renounce his faith in effectual, commended him to be beaten with clubs, and afterwards, to be beheaded, which was executed on February 14th, about the year 270."

There are several theories about the origin of Valentine's Day celebrations. Some believe the Romans had a mid-February custom where boys drew girls names in honor of the sex and fertility god Februata Juno; pastors "baptized" this holiday, like some others, by substituting the names of saints such as Valentine to suppress the practice. Others maintain that the custom of sending Valentines on February 14th stems from the belief that birds begin to pair on that date. By 1477 the English associated lovers with the feast of Valentine because on that day "every bird chooses him a mate." The custom started of men and women writing love letters to their Valentine on this day.

I am away for a few days of R & R. I am grateful to Fr. Kizito who will be taking all the masses while I am away.

STEWARDSHIP

I'll Do It

Chances are you've heard this one before, but it bears repeating. "This is a story about four people named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was asked to do it. Everybody was sure Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody's job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it but Nobody realized that Everybody wouldn't do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done."

In the reading from Isaiah today, we hear about the prophet's call. He has a vision of God's holiness and majesty so overpowering that he becomes sharply aware of the great gulf between him and God and between God and God's people. Yet the angel touches Isaiah's lips with the burning coal and says "Your wickedness is removed, your sin is purged." And when the voice of the Lord says, "Who will go for us?" Isaiah immediately replies, "Here I am; send me!" (Isaiah 6:7-9). Isaiah doesn't look around for someone else to do the job. He doesn't make excuses. He doesn't ask for time to think things over. Nor does he ask what will be required of him. This is a trust with no strings attached, a willingness to do God's Will wherever that may lead. Simon Peter and the other fishermen in today's Gospel have caught nothing, but Jesus tells them to let down their nets in deep water, and the catch is so huge that it takes all hands to haul it aboard. Like Isaiah, Simon Peter is only conscious of his own sinfulness. Jesus tells him not to be afraid, and all at once the whole crew join Simon and leave everything to follow wherever Jesus will lead them.

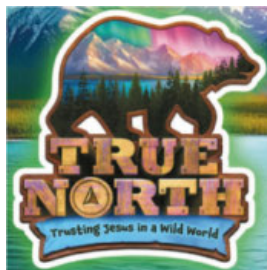

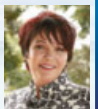
