PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Believe it or not, Lent is just around the corner. This special season will begin this Wednesday, on March 5th, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Our liturgies that day will be at 7:45am and 6:00pm with the distribution of ashes. Throughout our Lenten season, Stations of the Cross will be celebrated in the church every Friday evening beginning at 7:00pm.

Many of you have expressed gratitude for the Lenten "Little Black Books" which we are able to make available again this year. These books provide a simple daily reflection for each of the days of lent. We ask that each household take one book until everyone has had a chance to receive one. After that they are available until all are gone.

As we begin our "journey to Jerusalem" and as we continue the season of Lent, many people often ask about the regulations on the traditional disciplines of Fasting and Abstinence and so it may be helpful to note that the Church recommends that Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. In addition, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday Catholics from age 18-59 are encouraged to fast, limiting themselves to one full meal and two small meals each day. Why abstain from meat on some days and not some other food? The reason is probably the simple fact that historically speaking meat was always a special food and a luxury; meat at every meal is an extremely recent phenomenon, even in this country. Consequently, giving up something like this is giving up something "significant". Abstinence from meat has value to the extent that it is an act of self-denial. In general, the applicable principle is that we are expected, as followers of Christ, to "mature" as human beings spiritually. What the Church has in mind, however, is not simple emotional or even spiritual maturity but increasing one's likeness to Christ, whose life was one of habitual self-denial. For a conscientious Christian, this period of special abstinence is a time of building a more intense awareness of their dependence upon Christ, and, in addition, their obligation to share the goods of this world, with which they have been endowed by God, with others.

Pope John Paul II wrote about the season Lent with the following words: "Each year, the Lenten Season is set before us as a good opportunity for the intensification of prayer and penance, opening hearts to the docile welcoming of the divine will. During Lent, a spiritual journey is outlined for us that prepares us to relive the Great Mystery of the Death and Resurrection of Christ. This is done primarily by listening to the Word of God more devoutly and by practicing mortification more generously, thanks to which it is possible to render greater assistance to those in need."

Simple Wisdom

The Bemba live in Zambia, a country in southern Africa. Once wealthy from copper mining, the country has grown poorer through corruption and mismanagement. The Bemba live much like their ancestors, in villages of thirty to fifty grass-roofed mud huts. The family occupying each hut usually consists of several generations and the size of each village varies from about fifty to over one hundred fifty people. These farming people work very hard, but the soil is poor. In a good year they grow just about enough to feed themselves. Once the fertility of the soil wears out, the village must move to find fresh land to till. The Bemba have few material possessions. Disease and malnutrition haunt their steps, and no one survives long past the age of forty. Yet the Bemba have a remarkable tradition. When a person acts irresponsibly or unjustly, he or she is placed in the center of the village, alone and unshackled. All work ceases and every man, woman, and child in the village gathers in a large circle around the accused person. When everyone is present, each person in the community speaks to the accused. One by one, speaking unhurriedly, they describe all the good things that the person in the center of the circle has done in his or her life. Every single incident, every experience that can be recalled with any detail and accuracy is spelled out. All the positive attributes, good deeds, strengths, and kindnesses are recited carefully and at great length. Nothing is too trivial to relate. The ceremony may go on for several days. Finally, when every single person has had their say, the circle is broken. A joyful celebration takes place to welcome the person, both symbolically and literally, back into the community.

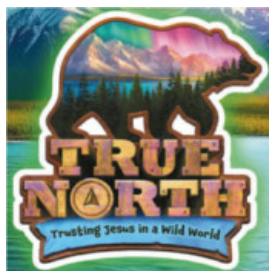

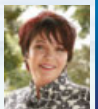
