FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

MARCH 9, 2025



Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.'" Then he took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a single instant. The devil said to him, "I shall give to you all this power and their glory; for it has been handed over to me, and I may give it to whomever I wish. All this will be yours, if you worship me." Jesus said to him in reply, "It is written:

*'You shall worship the Lord, your God,
and him alone shall you serve.'*

Then he led him to Jerusalem, made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written:

*'He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you,'

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

I went back to the old neighborhood a while ago and realized there what everyone who has ever tried to go home discovers. The trees have grown smaller and easier for climbing, the alley where we played hide-and-go-seek has grown narrower, the trip to the corner less daring, and all the old haunts so much less intriguing. But going back also drew forth in me a power I had not imagined or expected. Not only did it reintroduce me to who I am, it renewed the dream of who I could be. Going back to one's roots can do that because it's a going back to where it all began.

Lent can be such a time of returning to our roots. Some would see the season as penitential, a time of reparation for sin; others as a time for growing more prayerful or for reestablishing lives of service or for deepening faith. And it can be all of that. Yet the readings of this Lenten Sunday take us back to how it once was and who was once doing the shaping of life.

There are myriad ways of making the Lenten journey back to our roots. Spend time with the scriptures. Read the lives of the saints. Go on a retreat. Visit a shrine. Keep a journal. Pray the rosary again. Sit with silence. Make the Stations of the Cross. Offer peace to an enemy. Visit the sick or a shut-in. Give enough alms to notice the pinch. Do some spiritual reading. Fast and abstain from meat. They are all part of our tradition and shards of our own pasts. In them we will once more meet ourselves, perhaps as if for the first time, and remember dreams long lost in the clutter of life's demands.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, at our 9:00am Sunday mass we celebrate the Rite of Sending for our parishioners participating in the RCIA program. These men and women are preparing to enter the Church this Easter Vigil and are being "elected" by the Bishop of San Diego at a celebration Sunday afternoon to receive the Easter Sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Please keep these parishioners in your prayers in a special way as they journey toward this great celebration.

As a parish we continue to celebrate our Lenten journey every Friday as we reflect on the passion of Christ through the celebration of the Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross originated in Europe during the 12th century as a way for Christians who could not make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to "virtually" visit and walk in the footsteps of Christ. Since that time the Church has used this popular devotion as a way for the faithful to reflect more deeply on the passion and resurrection of Christ and understanding the meaning of the Cross in our own lives. We invite you to join us each Friday beginning at 6:00pm with a simple soup supper in the parish hall and then journey the Stations of the Cross at 7:00pm in the church.

As we journey through Lent I would ask you to keep in prayer the students from our School and Religious Education program who are preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on Saturday, March 22nd.

Speaking of the Sacrament of Reconciliation please note that our parish communal celebration will take place on Tuesday evening, April 8th at 7:00pm. Once again this year we will have several priests available to assist with this celebration.

A few weeks ago we initiated the 2025 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). As you heard me discuss the Annual Catholic Appeal seeks to raise \$3.5 million needed to support the many educational, spiritual and charitable works of the Diocese of San Diego. This year our parish goal for this campaign is \$57,000. If you have not already responded to this appeal I would ask that you fill out a pledge card and return it to us as soon as possible. Please know of our gratitude for your continued generosity.

Something Extra

How often have you been asked what you are giving up for Lent? Sometimes we never grow out of the childhood habit of just giving up candy or sugar! How about a different approach, by which you make an effort to do something extra to honor God in this season?

- Reconcile yourself with someone you don't like, someone you generally avoid, or someone you have injured in some way.
- Perform acts of kindness for people without expecting anything back.
- Buy a meal for a homeless person.
- Resolve neither to listen to nor pass on gossip.
- Take time to be in a natural outdoor space—your yard, a park, by a lake—even if it's only for half an hour.
- Read all you can about what causes poverty. Not only will you give yourself some useful lessons in economics, sociology, and biology, you will know better how to serve God's poor.
- Save the cost of one meal a day and donate it to a favorite charity at Easter time.
- Study, meditate, and pray with one or two scripture passages each day.
- Do some ordinary daily task, and think about God while doing it.
- If you are sick, confined to the house, or on the road a lot, pray for the needs of others.
- In a place you go to regularly—your office, the supermarket, school—think where Jesus might be in that place, and what you might do for him.
- Are there special prayers or devotions from your ancestral heritage that might help you grow spiritually?
- Clean out closets and give gently-used clothing and household items to a charity.
- Take bags of grocery items to the local food pantry.
- Take part in a weekday Mass, parish mission, or special Lenten prayer service.
- Keep a crucifix near you. Remember Jesus' death on the cross.

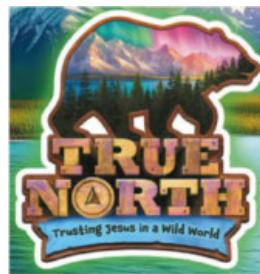

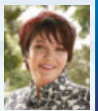
