He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.'"

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

One morning in 1888, Alfred Nobel, the man who invented dynamite, picked up the morning newspaper and, to his shock, read an account of his death. The reporter had made a mistake; it was his cousin, not he, who had died.

In reading his own obituary, Alfred Nobel realized just how he would be recognized and remembered should he die. He would be the "dynamite king," a merchant of death. This so disturbed and upset Nobel that he decided to give his life a new direction. He became involved in the work of peace and justice and made it a point to ensure that money was set aside so an annual award could be given to those engaged in that important work.

So when Alfred Nobel died, his obituary made no mention of his being a merchant of death. He was hailed instead for his humanitarian deeds, especially the establishment of the Nobel Peace Prize. You could say that the mistake in 1888 gave Alfred Nobel a second chance at life. As a result, the world was awarded a wonderful legacy.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As hopefully you are aware, last week Cardinal McElroy was installed as the Archbishop of Washington, D.C. In light of this, many people have asked what happens next. This last week a group of priests called the College of Consultors of the Diocese of San Diego, gathered to elect an Administrator to serve as the “ordinary” of the diocese until the Vatican appoints a new bishop for our diocese. I am pleased to report the Council has elected Bishop Michael Pham to serve in this role. You may know that Bishop Michael resides here at St. Mary Magdalene. Let us keep him and all the diocesan leadership in our prayers during this time of transition.

I would ask you to keep in prayer the more than 75 members of our school and religious education program whom this weekend celebrated the Rite of Reconciliation for the first time in preparation for their reception of First Eucharist. I am grateful to all those who are assisting in preparing these young people for this important moment in their lives.

As part of our Lenten Journey each Friday during lent we offer a simple soup supper in the parish hall beginning at 6:00pm followed by the Stations of the Cross beginning at 7:00pm in the church. I hope as many of you as possible with join us for these events.

I would like to thank those who have so generously responded to the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). We are currently working toward our goal of \$57,000. If you have not yet made a pledge to the ACA it is not too late and no pledge is too small. Additional ACA brochures and pledge envelopes are available on the table inside the main entrance to our church. We would like to see as many families participate as possible.

In his 2005 Encyclical letter entitled *Deus Caritas Est*, Pope Benedict wrote about the centrality of the concept of “Communion” to the identity of the Church. He wrote “Love of neighbor, grounded in the love of God, is first and foremost a responsibility for each individual member of the faithful, but it is also a responsibility for the entire ecclesial community at every level: from the local community to the particular Church and to the Church universal in its entirety. As a community, the Church must practice love. Love thus needs to be organized if it is to be an ordered service to the community. The awareness of this responsibility has had a constitutive relevance in the Church from the beginning: “All who believed were together and had all things in common; and they sold their possessions and goods and distributed them to all, as any had need”. In these words, Saint Luke provides a kind of definition of the Church, whose constitutive elements include fidelity to the “teaching of the Apostles”, “communion” (*koinonia*), “the breaking of the bread” and “prayer”.

The element of “communion” (*koinonia*) is not initially defined, but appears concretely in the verses quoted above: it consists in the fact that believers hold all things in common and that among them, there is no longer any distinction between rich and poor. As the Church grew, this radical form of material communion could not in fact be preserved. But its essential core remained: within the community of believers there can never be room for a poverty that denies anyone what is needed for a dignified life.”

Fruitful or Productive?

“Yes,” said Joel, “I’m hooked on productivity. I run a business, and my wife and I have three young children. I have to produce and my employees have to produce if we’re to accomplish anything. My days are jam-packed. If there’s any time left over I spend it with my family.” Joel’s thinking on productivity received a shake-up at a men’s retreat. The retreat leader asked a question. “When you think of Jesus, do you think of him with a daily to-do list? (‘Three people healed today. Two fast comebacks to the scribes and Pharisees. One really great parable told. Oh yes, and dinner for 5,000. And I got the disciples to distribute the leftovers. A very good day. Well done, me’).” Joel listened intently. “Jesus spoke wisely and constantly extended mercy and grace. He might now and then retreat from the crowds, yet when he was with people, he was really with them. He saw needs that others could not see. He loved people well. But was he productive? Productivity can become a mind-set of constantly moving forward. Being busy, not at times and in moderation, but as a lifestyle. Productivity seeks what fruitfulness claims as its starting point—the assurance of God’s presence and love.” Fruitfulness, Joel saw, allows you to be fully present in the moment. Fruitfulness is deeply rooted in the soil of God’s grace. Fruitfulness requires a fundamental trust in the Holy Spirit, like compost around the roots of the fig tree in today’s Gospel. The Spirit is working at all times and in all places and, if we allow it, is at work in us—busy or not.
