## FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

### A Scriptural Reflection

### Reflecting on God's Word

The stone probably didn't feel that heavy when it was first picked up. But it was a stone, not a pebble, and there were many of them. They would do damage, especially when hurled in self-righteous anger. Perhaps it helped the people to believe that no one stone could be blamed for her death. This was an act of the community, all of them in it together, standing up for the Law of Moses, and bringing down God's wrath upon an adulteress.

While things were starting to heat up, no one was paying much attention to the woman. They were all watching Jesus. What was with the crouching down and drawing in the dirt? You really couldn't tell whether he was writing or drawing or maybe he was just stalling for time.

Some said he had tricked them, worked some kind of magic, proof that he was indeed in league with Beelzebub. The more thoughtful ones were silent. One even said he thought Jesus was praying. Where else could his words have come from, words that redirected their gaze from the woman to themselves, words that caused stones to drop and feet to shuffle off?

His words continue to echo any time we find ourselves about to cast stones of condemnation at one another: "Let the one among you who is without sin . . ." After taking these words to heart, we might hear more clearly Jesus' final words, meant not only for her, but for us: Go and sin no more.

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As our Lenten season is drawing to a close I would like to remind you of our parish penance service which will take place this Tuesday, April 8th at 7:00pm in the Church. Once again this year we will have a number of priests available to assist with the celebration of the sacrament.

I would like to thank those who have so generously responded to the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). We are currently working toward our goal of \$57,000. If you have not yet made a pledge to the ACA it is not too late and no pledge is too small. Additional ACA brochures and pledge envelopes are available on the table inside the main entrance to our church. We would like to see as many families participate as possible.

During the 3rd, 4th and 5th, Sundays of Lent the members of our R.C.I.A. who are preparing to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist (the Elect) at our Easter Vigil this year celebrate what it called a "scrutiny". As the name implies a scrutiny is intended to assist the Elect in reflecting on their ongoing journey of conversion. The Scrutinies focus on the Lenten Cycle A readings for those Sundays. The first scrutiny focused on the "encounter, conversion and communion", the second focuses on the development of faith and the third will emphasis sharing in the promised resurrection. I would invite you to continue to keep these member of our community in your prayers as they enter into this final stage of preparation to receive the Easter Sacraments.

This coming Friday night the youth of our parish will offer a very special Stations of the Cross. It is called the "Shadow Stations". If you have been able to attend this event in the past you know what a wonderful production and reflection this evening has become. This year, the youth will also be offering a simple pasta dinner in the parish hall prior to the Stations. If you would like to join us for dinner that evening please RSVP so that we can anticipate how many dinners to prepare. The Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model for how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. They "are charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs". They respond to the basic needs of humanity as we journey together through this life.

### The seven Corporal Works of Mercy are:

**1. FEED THE HUNGRY:** There are many people in this world who go without food. When so much of our food goes to waste, consider how good stewardship practices of your own food habits can benefit others who do not have those same resources.

**2. GIVE DRINK TO THE THIRSTY:** Many of our brothers and sisters in Christ do not have access to clean water and suffer from the lack of this basic necessity. We should support the efforts of those working towards greater accessibility of this essential resource.

**3. SHELTER THE HOMELESS:** There are many circumstances that could lead to someone becoming a person without a home. Christ encourages us to go out and meet those without homes, affirming their worth and helping them seek a resolution to the challenges they face..

**4. VISIT THE SICK:** Those who are sick are often forgotten or avoided. In spite of their illness, these individuals still have much to offer to those who take the time to visit and comfort them.

**5. VISIT THE PRISONERS:** People in prison are still people, made in the image and likeness of God. No matter what someone has done, they deserve the opportunity to hear the Word of God and find the Truth of the message of Christ.

**6. BURY THE DEAD:** Funerals give us the opportunity to grieve and show others support during difficult times. Through our prayers and actions during these times we show our respect for life, which is always a gift from God, and comfort to those who mourn.

**7. GIVE ALMS TO THE POOR:** Donate money to organizations that have the ability to provide support and services for those in need. Do research and find organizations that put people in need first, rather than profit.
