## PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

### A Scriptural Reflection

#### Reflecting on God's Word

We can find the compassion of Jesus not only on the cross, but throughout his passion. It begins at the Last Supper when he praises the apostles, saying, "It is you who have stood by me in my trials," and promises that they will eat and drink with him in his kingdom (Luke 22:28–30). And while he predicts that Simon will deny him, he also comforts him: "Once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers" (22:32).

Later in the garden, when the mob comes for him and one of the disciples cuts off the right ear of the servant of the high priest, Jesus touches the servant and heals him. Jesus is tranquil before the Sanhedrin and Pilate and silent before Herod. On the way to Calvary, he stops to comfort women who are weeping for him, aware of what they themselves will have to face in days ahead.

But it is from the cross that we see Jesus as embodying God's compassion when Jesus prays, "Father, forgive them; they know not what they do" (23:34). Then, in one of the most tender scenes in the Gospels, in the final moments of his life, he turns to one of the criminals next to him who has asked that Jesus remember him and promises, today you will be with me in Paradise" (23:43).

We take up the palms today and greet Jesus as our Savior, as Son of God, as the Compassion of God. When we look at his hands extended on the cross, we can see him embracing the world.

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter into the most Holy Week in our Church calendar I hope as many of you as possible will make the special effort to join us for the celebration of the Triduum. We live in a culture that prides itself on doing things as quickly as possible. Nothing could be further from the spirit of the Holy Week liturgies. The readings are longer and there are more of them. There are processions and veneration and of course, the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation. Sometimes we would like our worship to match our cultural drive to be quick and expedient. It is easy to become impatient when Mass lasts more than an hour. As we celebrate the Holy Week liturgies, let us be grateful that the goal of liturgy is not expediency, rather, the goal is to enter the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection in order to be transformed by it. Our celebrations for Holy Week will continue on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper beginning at 7:00pm with adoration until 10:00pm. Then Good Friday we will celebrate the Stations of the Cross at 2:00pm, followed by our Good Friday service at 3:00pm. Holy Saturday we will begin our Celebration of Easter with our Easter Vigil beginning at 8:00pm. (note there will NOT be a 5:30pm mass that evening. On Easter Sunday our masses will be at 9:00am and 11:00am. Again note there will NOT be a 6:00pm mass on Easter Sunday

As our Lenten season draws to a close and we begin Holy Week, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support of our various Lenten programs. Our Soup Supper as well as our "Shadow Play" Stations of the Cross and pasta dinner were wonderful additions to our Lenten journey. Our parish penance service this past Tuesday evening was well attended and my gratitude goes out to the priests who joined us.

Today as we reflect on the passion of Christ we can take to heart the words of Pope John Paul II who said: "The reading of the Gospel passage has set before our eyes the *terrible scenes of Jesus' Passion*: his physical and moral suffering, Judas' kiss, the disciples' desertion, the trial before Pilate, the insults and scorn, the condemnation, the sorrowful way, the crucifixion. Finally, the most mysterious suffering: 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'. A loud cry, then death. Why all this? The beginning of the Eucharistic prayer will give us the answer: 'Though he was sinless, he suffered willingly for sinners. Though innocent, he accepted death to save the guilty. By his dying he has destroyed our sins. By his rising he has raised us up to holiness of life.' Our celebration thus expresses gratitude and love to the One who sacrificed himself for us, to the Servant of God who, as the prophet said, was not rebellious, did not turn backwards, gave his back to the smiters and did not hide his face from shame and spitting.

However, in reading the account of the Passion, the Church does not only consider Jesus' sufferings; she approaches this mystery, trembling yet confident, knowing that her Lord is risen. The light of Easter reveals the great teaching contained in the Passion: life is affirmed through the sincere gift of self to the point of suffering death for others, for the Other."

## STEWARDSHIP

### Take Up Your Cross

Father Oscar Romero was a timid, middle-level church bureaucrat in El Salvador. He silently complied with the wealthiest Salvadorians, who condemned all efforts to help the poor. Under their orders, the military were free to brutalize and kill anyone who got out of line. Romero was named Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. He neither intervened in nor protested at the violence. Then came a turning point: along with two companions, a priest the Archbishop knew personally was killed. Romero started asking questions and became a marked man. He presented the Pope with reports detailing human rights abuses in El Salvador. In 1980, as Romero was celebrating Mass, he said, "Those who surrender to the service of the poor through love of Christ will live like the grain of wheat that dies . . . The harvest comes because of the grain that dies." He was killed with a single sniper shot to the heart. To put other people first is to serve Christ himself, regardless of the risk.
