The Empty Tomb

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

The Legend of the First Easter Egg

According to tradition, after the Ascension of Jesus, Mary Magdalene traveled to Rome to preach the Gospel. While there, she reportedly had an audience with Emperor Tiberius.

As the story goes, she held up an egg and proclaimed, “**Christ is Risen!**” The emperor laughed and said a man rising from the dead was as likely as the egg in her hand turning red. At that moment, the egg turned a brilliant red—confirming her testimony of the Resurrection. This miraculous event became a lasting symbol of **new life and Christ’s victory over death.**

The egg has long been a **symbol of life, rebirth, and hope.** In early Christianity:

- The shell represents the sealed tomb of Christ.
- Cracking it open symbolizes His Resurrection.
- The red color signifies the blood Christ shed for our salvation.

This symbolism is still echoed in many Eastern Christian traditions, where **red-dyed eggs are a common part of Easter celebrations.**

A Scriptural Reflection

Reflecting on God's Word

I can remember as a child being afraid of the dark. Not all the time—just usually after seeing a horror movie. For nights after, I would peer into the darkness, trying to make sure there was nothing out there. Even as an adult there have been times when I walked through a dark place feeling an uneasiness that was hard to shake.

Easter in the Gospel of John begins in the dark. Night still holds the earth in its embrace. Darkness also gripped the hearts of Jesus' followers—the darkness of grief, sorrow, and hopelessness. Jesus of Nazareth—who had preached in a way no one else ever had, who had worked deeds of great power by curing the sick, healing lepers, giving sight to the blind, lifting up the lame, and who had even called the dead back to life—had been crucified and laid in the tomb. A large stone had been rolled in front of the entrance, death's final punctuation mark.

Only John tells us there was a garden where he was crucified, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. From this garden God decided to begin creation anew, so while it was still dark God breathed once again into a human figure, and the new Adam was raised up and would never die.

Not all darkness is to be feared. Sometimes it may even be necessary, summoning God to create once again, dispelling the shadow of death and despair that can settle over the human heart.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

“HE HAS RISEN; HE HAS TRULY RISEN, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!”

Tradition tell us that this is how the members of the early Church would greet each other on Easter morning, proclaiming the good news that Jesus Christ had risen from the dead and brought salvation to his people, and so we rejoice this Easter morning that the truth of that proclamation still resides with us today. I wish to take this opportunity, on behalf of the entire staff of Saint Mary Magdalene parish, to wish you a very joyous and grace-filled Easter Season.

In his Easter Homily of 2014 Pope Francis offered us the following reflection: After the death of the Master, the disciples had scattered; their faith had been utterly shaken, everything seemed over, all their certainties had crumbled and their hopes had died. But now that message of the women, incredible as it was, came to them like a ray of light in the darkness. The news spread: Jesus is risen as he said. And then there was his command to go to Galilee; the women had heard it twice, first from the angel and then from Jesus himself: “Let them go to Galilee; there they will see me”. “Do not fear” and “go to Galilee”. Galilee is the place where they were first called, where everything began! To return there, to return to the place where they were originally called. Jesus had walked along the shores of the lake as the fishermen were casting their nets. He had called them, and they left everything and followed him. To return to Galilee means to re-read everything on the basis of the cross and its victory, fearlessly: “do not be afraid”. To re-read everything – Jesus’ preaching, his miracles, the new community, the excitement and the defections, even the betrayal – to re-read everything starting from the end, which is a new beginning, from this supreme act of love. For each of us, too, there is a “Galilee” at the origin of our journey with Jesus. “To go to Galilee” means something beautiful, it means rediscovering our baptism as a living fountainhead, drawing new energy from the sources of our faith and our Christian experience. To return to Galilee means above all to return to that blazing light with which God’s grace touched me at the start of the journey. From that flame I can light a fire for today and every day, and bring heat and light to my brothers and sisters. That flame ignites a humble joy, a joy which sorrow and distress cannot dismay, a good, gentle joy. In the life of every Christian, after baptism there is also another “Galilee”, a more existential “Galilee”: the experience of a personal encounter with Jesus Christ who called me to follow him and to share in his mission. In this sense, returning to Galilee means treasuring in my heart the living memory of that call, when Jesus passed my way, gazed at me with mercy and asked me to follow him. To return there means reviving the memory of that moment when his eyes met mine, the moment when he made me realize that he loved me.

STEWARDSHIP

Transformation

The high point of our Christian faith and the most holy day in the Church year is celebrated today. “[I]f Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith” says Saint Paul (1 Corinthians 15:14). It is not easy for us to imagine the reality of Christ’s passion and then the great glory of Easter. Even artists have difficulties portraying the risen Jesus. The glorified, risen Jesus seems beyond even the greatest artistic imagination. He must have looked different in some ways, as his followers fail to recognize him at first, even the ones who know him best, and Jesus has to assure them that he is not a ghost. He invites the skeptical Thomas to touch his wounds, he appears and eats breakfast with Peter and six others on the lake shore and—in the intimacy of a shared meal at Emmaus—two disciples realize who he is as he takes bread, blesses and breaks it, and gives it to them. They “see” him by his actions. We receive this same Jesus as the bread blessed and broken at every Eucharist, and this is not just a symbol: the Lord truly gives himself to us. Dorothy Day found that we know the Lord and each other in the breaking of the bread, and this puts an end to our loneliness. She discovered this faith as an adult, becoming one of the last century’s greatest champions of the poor, forsaken, hungry, and homeless. True faith, like Dorothy Day’s, transforms us. Some have a sudden conversion, while for others it is a slower process that unfolds over time. If we come to know the truth of Easter it will overflow from our own life into those around us.

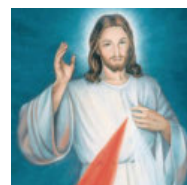

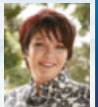
