## FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

### A Scriptural Reflection

#### Reflecting on God's Word

My father used to refer to the town of my—and his—birth as a “nickel-and-dime” town. As a child, I was never exactly sure what he meant, but it didn't sound like a compliment. I think it was similar to Micah's words about Bethlehem as “too small to be among the clans of Judah” (5:1). Another description would be “backwater.” Hardly a place deserving of great expectations. Yet backwater Bethlehem, city of David the shepherd boy, was to be the birthplace of the Messiah—not Jerusalem, center of government and religion, city of David the warrior king.

God's strange choices extend beyond geographical sites to the people on whom God sets eyes. A young betrothed girl up in the north, a barren woman down in the south—these were chosen to play pivotal roles in the story of salvation. The once-barren Elizabeth, soon to bring forth the greatest of all prophets, now proclaims God's most marvelous work and the little one through whom God is working: “Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb” (Luke 1:42).

Elizabeth cues us to join in the response of the baby in her womb: to allow our hearts and spirits to leap for joy. Again and again God works through those who are open to the Spirit. Blessed are they who place their trust in the Lord, who continues to come to give us new life.

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

During these holy days, as we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the gift of God to mankind, I would like to take this opportunity, on behalf of the staff of St. Mary Magdalene, to wish you a very merry Christmas. I also wish to thank all of you who throughout the year gifted our parish with your time in various ministries, your talent in music and art and your treasure in support of our parish. I pray that Christ may come to you this holiday season with the gift of Love, the blessing of Hope, and the promise of Peace.

I would like to remind you of our mass schedule for Christmas. We will begin our celebration of Christmas with a 5:00pm Mass on Christmas Eve, Tuesday, December 24th. We are calling this our "Family Mass" as it will be geared toward families with younger children and in particular the homily will be focused toward the younger ages. We will also celebrate a 10:00pm Mass on Christmas Eve. Then, on Christmas Day, we will celebrate Mass at 10:00am only.

Each year on Christmas day after celebrating mass the Holy Father steps out onto the balcony overlooking St. Peters Square and delivers a reflection called the "Urbi et Orbi" literally meaning to the "City and to the World". I would like to share with you a brief passage from the reflection of Pope Francis from 2018. *Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy Christmas!* Jesus, the Son of God, the Savior of the world, is born for us, born in Bethlehem of a Virgin, fulfilling the ancient prophecies. The Virgin's name is Mary, the wife of Joseph. Humble people, full of hope in the goodness of God, are those who welcome Jesus and recognize him. And so the Holy Spirit enlightened the shepherds of Bethlehem, who hastened to the grotto and adored the Child. Then the Spirit led the elderly and humble couple Simeon and Anna into the temple of Jerusalem, and they recognized in Jesus the Messiah. "My eyes have seen your salvation", Simeon exclaimed, "the salvation prepared by God in the sight of all peoples" (Lk 2:30). Yes, brothers and sisters, Jesus is the salvation for every person and for every people! Today I ask him, the Savior of the world, to look upon our brothers and sisters in Iraq and Syria, who for too long now have suffered the effects of ongoing conflict, and who, together with those belonging to other ethnic and religious groups, are suffering a brutal persecution. May Christmas bring them hope, as indeed also to the many displaced persons, exiles and refugees, children, adults and elderly, from this region and from the whole world. May indifference be changed into closeness and rejection into hospitality, so that all who now are suffering may receive the necessary humanitarian help to overcome the rigors of winter, return to their countries and live with dignity.

May the Lord open hearts to trust, and may he bestow his peace upon the whole Middle East, beginning with the land blessed by his birth, thereby sustaining the efforts of those committed effectively to dialogue between Israelis and Palestinians.... May Jesus save the vast numbers of children who are victims of violence, made objects of trade and trafficking, or forced to become soldiers; children, so many abused children. May he be close to all who suffer from illness. As I thank all who are courageously dedicated to assisting the sick and their family members, I once more make an urgent appeal that the necessary assistance and treatment be provided. The Child Jesus. My thoughts turn to all those children today who are killed and ill-treated, be they infants killed in the womb, deprived of that generous love of their parents and then buried in the egoism of a culture that does not love life; be they children displaced due to war and persecution, abused and taken advantage of before our very eyes and our complicit silence. I think also of those infants massacred in bomb attacks, also those where the Son of God was born. Even today, their impotent silence cries out under the sword of so many Herods. On their blood stands the shadow of contemporary Herods. Truly there are so many tears this Christmas, together with the tears of the Infant Jesus.

### Joy To The World

When the prairies of this country were opened up to settlers in the nineteenth century, families who went West and staked a claim on the land lived hard, isolated lives miles away from any neighbors. The husbands did backbreaking farm work to support their families and the wives struggled with child-rearing, cleaning, and cooking in very primitive conditions. When families met, the women would fall about each other's necks, embracing tearfully at the joy of being together. This is but an echo of today's Gospel. Luke tells of two women, Mary and Elizabeth, united again after time apart. Each is pregnant and will bear a child who will change the world. What is expressed between them is amazing, overflowing, unconcealed joy. Elizabeth is a woman who has awaited pregnancy for years, and Mary is the one chosen to bear the Messiah. They sense the future unfolding before them, brought about by the hand of God. On this last Sunday of Advent, Mary and Elizabeth remind us that Christmas is not simply about the birth of a child in an obscure corner of the world. It is about recognizing light—the light of Christ, the Anointed One, breaking into the world's darkness and into our hearts.

### UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF CALIFORNIA

In re The Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego  
Case No. 24-02202

**Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: FEBRUARY 3, 2025**

#### YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO

On June 17, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego, sometimes referred to as The Diocese of San Diego (“Debtor”) filed for protection under chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code (the “Bankruptcy Code”).

**If you were sexually abused by any person connected with Debtor, you must file a claim so as to be received by February 3, 2025, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Debtor. Even if you have already filed a lawsuit against Debtor alleging abuse you must still file a claim to maintain and/or preserve your rights.**

**Claims based on acts or omissions of the Debtor that occurred before June 17, 2024, must be filed on or before February 3, 2025, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before June 17, 2024.**
