



The Last Things

No one really likes to think about the last of anything, particularly the last days of our lives. Yet there is a side to our nature that is drawn to thoughts of the end of life at this time of the year. We're beginning the last month of the church year and the second-to-last month of the calendar year. Night falls earlier and earlier each day. Leaves fall from the trees, leaving branches that look dead. Skies are gray. It is November.

The Church uses these waning days and darker skies as the season to remind us of the last things. Today's feast, the Solemnity of All Saints, is the centerpiece of three days that point to doctrines we proclaim each time we say the Nicene Creed: "We believe in the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting!" And while the days and our hearts may be dark, the readings today are bright with the light of faith. John's vision in the book of Revelation reveals dazzling angels and white-robed saints gathered in triumph around the throne of God. In the responsorial psalm we sing our longing to see God's face, and in the second reading John writes that we are God's children and will, in fact, see God "as he is" (1 John 3:2). This is our hope. This is God's promise.

The Blessed

Then, in the Gospel, we read Jesus' formula for saint-making. "You will be blessed," we are told: blessed if we are poor in spirit, sorrowing, lowly, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, peacemakers, and persecuted. Matthew's words in this Gospel point us directly back to the first reading. "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb" (Revelation 7:14). Today we celebrate the triumph of those who already gaze on the face of God. Tomorrow we cry out for mercy with those in purgatory, who, like us on earth, still long to see God's face.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

This week is, of course, our national election and so as the election draws near the Bishops of the United States remind us: "The Catholic community is large and diverse. We are Republicans, Democrats, and Independents. We are members of every race, come from every ethnic background, and live in urban, rural, and suburban communities. We are CEO's and migrant farm workers, senators and person on public assistance, business owners and union members. But we are all called to a common commitment to protect human life and stand with those who are poor and vulnerable. We cannot be indifferent to or cynical about the obligations of citizenship. As voters and advocates, candidates and contributors, we are called to provide a moral leaven for our democracy."

This week we also celebrate our patronal feast. Saturday, November 7th is the Feast of San Diego de Alcalá de Henares. San Diego (St. Didacus) was born about 1400 at San Nicholas in Andalusia, of poor and God-Fearing parents. He entered the Third Order of St. Francis as a young man and spent several years as a hermit. Later he entered the Franciscan convent in Castile and was admitted to solemn vows as a lay brother. After a few years he was sent as a missionary to the Canary Islands and went on to become the guardian of the chief friary on the islands at Fortaventura. He returned to Spain and was sent to Rome in 1450 to attend the great jubilee and the canonization ceremonies of St. Bernardine of Siena. While he was in Rome an epidemic broke out. Diego attended the sick with great charity and trust in God. Despite the lack of supplies in the city at the time, Diego always had ample provision for his patients. He miraculously restored many of them to health by making the Sign of the Cross over them. He would eventually return to Spain and when he felt that the end of his life was drawing near, he asked for an old and worn-out habit, so that he might die in it as a true son of St. Francis. He died on November 12, 1463, at the Franciscan monastery Alcalá, pressing a crucifix to his heart and repeating the words of the Good Friday chant: "Precious the wood, precious the nails, precious the weight they bear." He was canonized by Pope Sixtus V, in 1588.


The Catholic Church in the United States will celebrate National Vocation Awareness Week, November 1-7, 2020. This observance, sponsored by the U.S. bishops' Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations, is a special time for parishes in the U.S. to foster a culture of vocations for the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life. Pope Francis, in his message of April 26, 2015 on the 52nd Day of World Prayer for Vocations states; "Responding to God's call means allowing Him to help us leave ourselves and our false security behind, and to strike out on the path which leads to Jesus Christ, the origin and destiny of our life and our happiness." The Holy Father stresses, "The Christian vocation, rooted in the contemplation of the Father's heart, thus inspires us to solidarity in bringing liberation to our brothers and sisters, especially the poorest." National Vocations Awareness Week is designed to help promote vocation awareness and to encourage young people to ask the question: "To what vocation in life is God calling me?" "Encouraging others to recognize the promptings of the Holy Spirit and to follow Christ without reservations are key elements in supporting a culture of vocations," said Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of Raleigh, North Carolina, chairman of the U.S. bishops' Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations. "With God's grace, we can have a positive impact on others who may be open to considering a vocation to priesthood or religious life, by simply inviting them to think and pray about it. Our enthusiasm and willingness to speak directly to others about vocations just might be the conversation someone need to respond to God's call."

During this Vocations Awareness Week it is important that we keep in prayer Greg Skiano, son of Deacon Ralph and Peggy Skiano, who is currently in his first year of formation towards the priesthood at St. Francis Center on the campus of the University of San Diego. May God bring to fulfillment the good work that he has begun.
