Meeting Handout

I. Rules of Engagement

- i. B: Be open (have an open mindset; putting judgement/filters to one side; eliminate "but" and replace with "and." Be curious.
- ii. R: Respect each other (everyone brings a unique blend of knowledge, expertise, experience, and skills. Listen respectfully and consider the possibility)
- iii. **A: All ideas are valuable** (you never know which idea will be a brilliant one)
- iv. **I: Invite contributions** (help each other to draw ideas from everyone; introduce important moments of self-reflection)
- v. **N: No negativity** (No judgement or criticism. Leverage the group's collective wisdom to build on each other ideas and explore the range of possibilities)
- vi. **S: Strive for quantity** (More ideas; more choices quantity now; quality later)
- vii. **T: Take turns talking** (One person at a time; truly listen)
- viii. O: Originality is a plus (Impossible ideas can stretch our imagination...they are gold dust that can unlock the unexpected)
- ix. R: Regularly take breaks (Build in time to refresh everyone)
- x. M: Make it fun! (Having fun keeps you energized)

II. Process of brainstorming

- i. Brainstorm all ideas open, freely, quantity
- ii. Narrow down the list of ideas using set criteria,
 - 1. Does it fit in our area of focus?
 - 2. Is it feasible? Will it require additional resources/time? What are the resources and time commitment?
 - 3. Will the pastor buy in?
 - 4. What is the end result? What would the timeline look like?
